## **Local Admission Forum – appointment of members**

**Service:** Walsall Children's Services - Serco

Wards: All

### 1. Summary of report

This report provides details of nominations received since the approval of the new arrangements by Council and the subsequent appointment of members in January 2010.

#### 2. Recommendations

- 2.1 That Council approves appointment of the following as members of the Walsall Admission Forum for a four year term of office (subject to their continuing eligibility) from 22 February 2010:
  - Brett Westwood (Foundation schools, primary)
  - Alison Bruton (voluntary aided schools, secondary)
  - Bernard Dickenson (academies)
  - Rajesh Patel (parents, primary sector)
  - Karen Bird (parents, primary sector).
- 2.2 That Council requests further reports following receipt of further nominations.

#### 3. Background information

- 3.1 At the meeting on 9 November 2009, Council approved a new constitution for the membership of Walsall's Local Admission Forum (see **Appendix A**) and appointed Councillors Carpenter and Walker as local authority representatives.
- 3.2 Admission Forums provide a vehicle for local authorities and other key interested parties to discuss the effectiveness of local admission arrangements, consider how to deal with difficult admission issues and advise admission authorities on ways in which their arrangements can be improved. Their main focus is to consider the fairness of arrangements in their local context. Admission authorities of all maintained schools and academies, when exercising their functions, must have regard to any advice offered by the Forum.

- 3.3 Nominations have been sought from the relevant bodies and organisations detailed in the table below. Further nominations have now been received and Council is recommended to appoint the following as members of Walsall's Local Admission Forum:
  - Brett Westwood (Foundation schools, primary), Headteacher, Park Hall Infants School
  - Alison Bruton (voluntary aided schools, secondary), Headteacher, Queen Mary's High School
  - Bernard Dickenson (academies), Principal, Shelfield Community Academy
  - Rajesh Patel (parents, primary sector, Delves Infants School)
  - Karen Bird (parents, primary sector, Bloxwich CE Primary School).
- 3.4 The parent governor appointed to represent secondary schools feels that she is no longer able to do so for unforeseeable reasons and has resigned.
- 3.5 A number of vacancies remain and officers are working with the Primary and Secondary Forums and other groups to secure further nominations.

#### 4. Resource considerations

- 4.1 **Financial**: There are no direct financial implications.
- 4.2 **Legal**: Local authorities were required to review the membership of their Admission Forum and reconstitute it to meet the requirements set out in the School Admissions (Local Authority Reports and Admission Forums) (England) Regulations 2008. These changes were also set out in the School Admissions Code published in February 2009. The 2007 Regulations which prescribed changes to the membership of Forums have been revoked.
- 4.3 **Staffing**: There are no direct implications arising from this report.

### 5. Citizen impact

Admission Forums have a key role in ensuring a fair admissions system that promotes social equity and consider how well existing and proposed admission arrangements serve the interests of children and parents within the area of the local authority.

### 6. Community safety

There are no direct implications arising from this report.

### 8. Performance and risk management issues

- 8.1 **Risk**: The Council is required to appoint members of Walsall's Admission Forum in line with the Regulations.
- 8.2 **Performance management**:: Local authorities must submit an annual report on admissions to the Schools Adjudicator; this includes details of the membership of the Forum. The Schools Adjudicator should refer matters concerning membership and the prescribed maximum limit of an Admission Forum to the Secretary of State where they do not comply with the Regulations.
