157/07 Public Forum

Rupy Pandaal stated that he had reported a problem at the Community Forum with regard to accessing a gate at Pool Hayes. He asked whether it would be possible for people to have a key to the gates. In response, it was reported that this issue would be investigated.

Councillor Coughlan raised the issue of traffic calming in Western Avenue. He asked what efforts were being made to reduce the speed of cars. In response it was reported that Officers would investigate this matter and report back to the next meeting.

Councillor Creaney stated that one of the speed cameras along the Wolverhampton Road was behind a tree and needed to be relocated. Officers reported that they would investigate this issue and report back to the next meeting.

A member of the public stated that further road traffic measures were required on the Wolverhampton Road, as children on motorbikes could simply drive between the humps. In response, it was reported that options for traffic calming would be brought back to the next meeting.

A member of the public questioned whether vehicles travelling along Clarkes Lane would be allowed to turn left. In response, it was reported that this matter would be investigated and reported to the next meeting. Councillor Underhill reported that vehicles were being driven through Willenhall Town Centre during prohibited hours. Councillor Cook stated that efforts had been made to pedestrianise the area once before, however, this was not effective. It was questioned whether it would be viable to have a series of automatic bollards to the entrance and exit of Willenhall Town Centre to ensure that vehicles could not enter or egress between 9.00 a.m. and 4.00 p.m. In response, it was reported that these issues would be taken to the Town Centre Working Group.

A member of the public questioned what had happened to traffic wardens. In response, Steve Pretty explained that the Council would have authority to act in respect of decriminalise parking and would undertake enforcement action. It was estimated that this would be in place by April 2008.

The issue regarding public transport provision from Short Heath to New Cross was raised as the level and frequency of the service was deemed insufficient.. In response, it was agreed that this issue should be taken up through a Health Community Action Group and that representatives from the bus operatives be invited to the meeting.
