Summary of items considered in private session

2684 Sale of freehold interest in Meadow House, Willenhall

Councillor A. Andrew presented the report.

The Cabinet decided that in relation to marketing by Edwards Moore of the Council's land, shown edged in red on plan EPMS 2042/1, together with the adjoining privately-owned land, shown edged in red on plan EPMS 2042/2 Appendix A, for sale on the open market, the Executive Director for Regeneration be delegated authority in consultation with the portfolio holder for Regeneration to approve the terms for the disposal of the freehold interest in the land to the highest bidder in respect of the 2 sites combined with a split of the total sale proceeds between the Council and the private party, provided these terms include the price satisfying the best consideration principles of Section 123 Local Government Act 1972 and the transaction not reaching legal completion until the purchaser has obtained any necessary planning permission from the Local Planning Authority.

2685 New affordable housing – development of clawback options

Councillor A. Andrew presented the report, together with a supplementary report.

The Cabinet approved that why clawback payments are waived to enable a viable why housing development programme. This will apply to all why property and land sales which are subject to the clawback provision of the Transfer Agreement. This is subject to all proceeds from the waived clawback being reinvested into why's 2011/15 affordable housing investment programme, the approval of which will be the subject of a subsequent report.
