57/09 REVISED DRAFT REVENUE BUDGET AND DRAFT CAPITAL PROGRAMME 2010/11 FOR REGENERATION PORTFOLIO

The Panel considered the revised draft revenue and capital budget proposals for 2010/11 for the Regeneration Portfolio.

Draft Revenue Budget 2010/11

Councillor Andrew highlighted the revised revenue budget for the Regeneration Portfolio.

A Member of the Panel raised the proposed closure of Willenhall Leisure Centre (WLC) that was a part of the Leisure and Culture Portfolio and expressed concerns at the wider implications this proposed closure could have. The following resolution was proposed and seconded:

'That in considering the draft corporate revenue budget for 2010/11 the Regeneration Scrutiny and Performance Panel expresses concern at the knock on effects of the proposed closure of Willenhall Leisure Centre will have on the future viability of the town centre from the following view points:

- Health
- Regeneration
- Leisure and Culture

Further to this the Regeneration Scrutiny and Performance Panel recommend to Cabinet that it considers the following amendments to draft revenue budget for 2010/11 to enable Willenhall Leisure Centre to remain open whilst the Community Services Scrutiny and Performance Panel establish a working group to investigate how it might be possible to reduce the unit costs at Willenhall Leisure Centre:

On being put to the vote the motion was declared lost.

Even though the motion was lost the Leader of the Council thanked the Member for his budget proposals and undertook to discuss them with his Cabinet colleagues.

Draft Capital Programme 2010/11

Councillor Andrew highlighted the draft capital programme for 2010/11 to the Panel.

Demolition of redundant buildings to save on rates - £200,000 (mainstream funded)

Following a questions Councillor Andrew explained that this money was to demolish three buildings on the Walsall Gigaport site. Rates for redundant buildings were high and the authority would save money by demolishing them.

Aid and Adaptations - £1,500,000 (mainstream funded)

The Panel were pleased with the level of funding proposed for this important area but expressed concerns regarding the value for money the Council received as a high proportion of this budget was used for tenders and other procedural steps.

Darlaston Baths roof - £200,000 (mainstream funded)

The Leader explained that the Council would seek to reclaim the cost of these works from the architect as it was possible that the problems with the roof were caused by a design fault.

Walsall Town Hall toilet refurbishment - £40,000 (reserve list)

The Panel expressed the wish that the Council received value for money from this, and all other, capital works.

The Panel discussed public toilets which was acknowledged as an important issue by the Leader.
