7. **SENDI Update** 17.10.17 Ms Goss gave a verbal update which included:-• Working to establish a new Parents/Carer Forum to establish a new group to reach broader range of people, especially around SEN • Developing exclusive practice training – 73 in attendance • Local Offer – has been a big challenge for Walsall and final soon to be launched onto the corporate website • Walsall currently has 490 care plans remaining to be transferred into EHCPs by 23.03.18, with a number of staff seconded to assist. The plans will be reviewed to ensure quality, particularly for senior school pupils • The electronic system EHCP module is moving forward and is currently being piloted • The permanent SEN Officer post plus Educational Psychologist posts have been advertised. There is currently a shortage of EPs within local councils - Walsall was required to have 9.2 Educational Psychologists but currently had 5.8. All local Councils currently trying to recruit EPs Report to A report will be taken to Cabinet of 25 October regarding Cabinet 25 children with special educational needs and who have October SEMH who are over-represented in out of borough placements Ms Goss to check In response to offers of support and an enquiry if there were with regards to any opportunities for staff secondments to carry out EHCPs, secondment Ms Goss stated she would look into the request. opportunities The Chairman asked that all future Schools Forum agenda All officers items be written reports as opposed to verbal updates. 8. **Review of LGPS Past Service Pension Costs** 17.10.17 **Apportionment** A report had been submitted to provide alternative options for the allocation of past service pension costs relating to the local government pension scheme (LGPS) The Chair stated that he felt the report should be taken back to Primary Forum for further discussion and that primary governors and maintained secondary school contacts should be invited to the relevant meeting. In response, Mr. Fox, a new Primary Governor representative advised Schools Forum he would benefit from further explanation as he did not feel able to vote on the item in question without further explanation.
