- geared towards KS3 / KS4 KS2 does not seem to have been acknowledged
- need clear definitions of reasons
- what happening to children out of school (CME)
- schools share the aims but issues remained when there were no other options other than to exclude a pupil
- why was New Leaf Centre's ceiling age at 25 and whether some money could be utilised to increase its capacity
- when would the 2014/15 exclusion data be available

In response to questions, Mrs Poole reported that the CME group met monthly and she would provide data for the next Schools Forum, the New Leaf Centre would be tracking long term pupils, additional money to be invested but the ethos should be on pupils remaining in a school.

Mrs Poole to provide CME data to March meeting.

Ms Guest advised the 2014/15 exclusions data would be published in July 2017.

Mr Davies reported the overall feel from Primary Heads was to back the recommendations contained in the report. This was seconded by Mrs Sheehy.

Schools Forum noted the recommendations made to standardise practice across agencies.

7. School Ready Investment and Update on Two Year Old 10.01.17 Expenditure

A report was submitted.

Ms Stokes outlined the contents of the report.

In response to questions, Ms Stokes stated the EY Improvement Plan and the EY/LAC Plan had not been shared but would be included on the Link and that she would confirm/clarify details of attendees of the SLE/hub leaders programme and the literacy and numeracy specialist programme.

In relation to the Schools Forum's position regarding payments towards refreshments for training and conferences, the Chair stated attendees should be valued and refreshments must continue to be provided.

Ms Stokes to include EY info on Link and confirm detail of attendees on training programmes

8. 10.01.17

SEN Update (verbal)

Ms Goss gave a verbal update and advised Forum Members of the following:-

- Shortage of EPs remains a challenge
- 735 (SEN) statements remaining for transfer (46%)
- Statutory time scales remain a challenge currently 35.7% completed
- 262 requests for needs assessments since January 2016 -205 agreed
- EHCPs taken on colleges / FE, 16+ have EHOPS
- SEN support is being looked at in relation to retainment levels as Walsall is below the national average
- Linking with CCG and looking for assistance from the Health Authority
- Significant additional school places required and discussions taking place – meeting next week with Headteachers – difficulties around Years 1 and 2 and Years 10 and 11 (significant behaviour difficulties), trying to commission special school places
- Looking at EHCPs to make more streamlined and will meet with workers and officers

The Chairman requested clarification regarding the commissioning of additional places. In response, Mrs Poole stated Walsall needed to scrutinise its current provision to prevent young people going out of the local authority and thus reducing out of borough assistance. Ms Guest added that EHCPs now covered young people up to the age of 25 and this could have serious financial implications. Officers were working with WAC and Walsall College on this issue.

9. 10.01.17

Early Years Funding Formula Review

A report was submitted.

Mr Haynes informed Schools Forum of the work that had been undertaken with regard to the Early Years Funding Formula and he highlighted the salient points contained therein and sought the Forum's views of the proposed financial arrangements for 2017/18.

- Government commitment was for 3 years with no commitment after this period
- Mrs Draper informed Schools Forum of a 'Save State Funding Nursery Schools' petition and asked members to support either through Facebook or via petition.parliament.uk/petitions

	Mr. Haynes outlined the contents of the report and drew attention to paragraph 4 which detailed the 2017/18 Schools Funding Formula Pro-forma.	
	In response to questions asked, Mr Haynes and Ms Morris confirmed that 4 x secondary schools and 26 x primary schools would see reduced funding with other schools seeing	

an improvement in their funding; the IDACI element was calculated on post codes and worked out in the proportion of pupils within the schools; the consideration of deprivation of particular areas was not taken into consideration by the DfE only historical spending.

The Chairman expressed concern that Schools Forum would have to make a decision with a lack of information in relation to the change of methodology.

- 2) That Schools Forum noted the adjustments to funding factor values that are required for 2017/18 to ensure that allocations to mainstream schools via the local funding formula are affordable within the funding that is available (updated values set out at Appendix B of the report)

- Option 2 seems too blunt a tool and was Option 3 as it based on now?
- A transition period is required and therefore more time is needed to consider due to the large cost implications
- Would like to see a model with the full data included (least hurting)
- Website available for comments <u>schoolcuts.org</u> but not many people aware of it
