Aldridge and Beacon Area Panel CCTV Camera Locations Tuesday 14th July 2015

Introduction

This report seeks to obtain the view of the Aldridge and Beacon Area Panel on the effectiveness of the current re deployable camera stock and any additional comments/views on the boroughs CCTV system. This information will be used to inform an options review of the CCTV infrastructure within Walsall to be undertaken within the near future.

Recommendation

That the Panel provides Officers with its view on current stock of CCTV cameras and the Borough's CCTV system.

Report

1. Background

- 1.1 Walsall Council's CCTV Service monitors 91 fixed cameras located within a number of areas of the borough. The Control Room is located within the Streets Corner Response Centre at Walsall Wood and in addition to the fixed cameras manages and monitors 28 re deployable cameras for various council departments. The CCTV Control Room is manned 365 days a year with at least one operator always being on duty. The council also owns a number of covert cameras used to tackle specific issues including for example fly tipping.
- 1.2 Due the passing of time and technological progress it is recognised that much of the existing CCTV infrastructure and equipment is now in need of upgrade to ensure that Walsall benefits from an up to date and effective system. The re deployable stock (Domehawk and Apache Cameras) in particular is approaching the end of its working life and it is important that re deployable cameras continue to be available to support a range of enforcement and reassurance activity.
- 1.3 In order that this complex task is done in the most effective way a specialist consultant is to be commissioned to undertake an evaluation of the current infrastructure and equipment and to produce a full options appraisal as to the possible and best way forward. These options could include a capital investment by the council, commissioning a third party to manage/provide the system or entering into a shared services arrangement. Importantly the review will include consideration of the technical capabilities of our existing CCTV systems and the way in which these can be upgraded in line with technological advancements.

- 1.4 Any review of the current system will of course include consideration of the existing cameras, their location and the level of usage for each unit. It is of interest that it is estimated that each fixed camera costs in the region of £1500 per year and that since the fixed cameras were originally installed technology in relation to re deployable cameras that can be moved around the borough as required has moved on significantly. To assist with this analysis the Walsall Intelligence Network has produced a detailed report on CCTV usage which has been used to inform this report. Please see **appendix A** which is referred to throughout this report.
- 1.5 The consideration and evaluation of data paints one part of the overall picture but local intelligence and the views of key stakeholders are also important and will be used to inform the process. To support this Elected Members and Area Panels are to be consulted such that their views can be obtained.

2.0 Walsall's CCTV System

- 2.1 Walsall's 91 fixed cameras are located within five of the boroughs six Area Partnerships and for evaluation purposes have been clustered accordingly. Streetly, Pheasey and Aldridge is the only Area Partnership in which none of the fixed cameras are located. Map 1 of the appended report shows the location of all fixed CCTV cameras across the borough in addition to re-deployable (Domehawk and Apache) deployments made over a 4.5 year period. It is of note that a number of these will be repeat locations to which a camera has been deployed on more than one occasion. Table 1 of the report shows unsurprisingly that the majority of the cameras (44%) are located in and around central Walsall whilst Darlaston (of the Area Partnerships in which cameras are located) has the smallest number (8%).
- 2.2 The CCTV Control Room records the number of incidents captured by each camera and Table 2 details that over a three year period to June 2015 a total of 15,131 incidents have been captured. Of these the vast majority (89%) relate to the Walsall camera Cluster with the least number (1%) captured in Darlaston, albeit this is unsurprising due to the smaller number of cameras in that area. Across the borough the top three incident types captured by the cameras are Suspicion (17%), Public Order (15%) and Anti-Social Behaviour (14%). Despite the large number of incidents captured the number of occasions when data has following an incident taking place been copied to tape or DVD for use in a subsequent investigation is 1406 over the 3 year period.
- 2.3 To support analysis a series of maps that detail incidents of crime, violent crime and anti-social behaviour over a three year period have been produced. These maps have been provided at a borough wide (on pages 7 and 8 of the report) and camera cluster level and show hot spots of activity against camera locations. The mapping at a borough wide level shows that generally fixed cameras have been appropriately located within key hotspot areas. It is inevitable that not all hot spots are covered by fixed cameras, however there is a strong correlation between these locations and the use of the re deployable cameras. This demonstrates the usefulness of this more flexible resource.

3.0 Aldridge and Beacon Area Partnership

- 3.1 The borough wide maps refer to above demonstrate encouragingly that hot spots for all crime, violent crime and ASB do not predominantly fall within this Area Partnership. This is clearly positive for residents and businesses and largely supports the lack of fixed CCTV cameras in the locality. However this unfortunately does not mean that there are no crime and ASB problems in this Area Partnership and there are clearly localised hot spots of activity, for example around Aldridge Town Centre and the Collingwood area. These locations have been covered by re deployable cameras and this strongly supports the need for this valuable resource to be extended/maintained. It is clearly not possible for fixed cameras to cover all problem locations due to the size of the borough and the fact that at least some hot spots for crime/ASB will be transitory. The ability to deploy mobile resources and use them intelligently allows us to tackle these problem locations and provide support and respite for our communities.
- 3.2 This report summarises the analysis produced by the WIN and is intended to inform discussion at the Area Panel. Comments and observations made by the panel will be fed into the evaluation to be undertaken and are an important part of the process.

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Analysis of CCTV usage

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A Walsall Intelligence Network (WIN) collaboration

Back ground


Source information used for this analysis is based upon a list of fixed cameras within scope of this analysis as at June 2015; of which there are 91 cameras in total.

Fixed camera locations are mapped against three key datasets, Violence with Injury, Committed Crime and Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB).

Domehawk camera locations are also mapped. These cameras have been used to cover tasking hotspot areas with data on their use included from December 2010 to date.

It includes analysis of fixed camera footage incidents in a three year period between June 2012 to June 2015; detailing incidences for each camera from which an incident is recorded, hence from 87 cameras including incident date and reason description (category name).

Map 1 below shows where fixed and domehawk cameras are situated within the borough.



Incidents Dataset Analysis

In total there were 15,131 camera incidents within the dataset¹. See **Appendix 1a** for summary list of fixed cameras from which incidents have been recorded with a corresponding total number per camera recorded within the three year period.

For ease of analysis the cameras have been divided into five geographic camera 'clusters';

- Walsall Town Centre/Caldmore/Palfrey,
- Bloxwich,
- Brownhills,
- Darlaston and
- Willenhall. This excludes camera #83 Lichfield Square Car Park, New Invention as this camera stands out on its own, is recently installed and hasn't recorded any incidences as yet.

Analysis of the camera incidence dataset shows the extent to which cameras are being used, and the reasons for their use based on the incidents recorded from them.

Cameras within the Walsall Town Centre cluster are, when taken together, the most used cameras within the borough. Just under half (44%) of all cameras are located within the Walsall camera cluster and these cameras account for the vast majority (89%) of camera footage 'incidence' recorded. **Table 1**.

There are 4 cameras from which no incidents have been recorded within the three year period and hence do not feature in the incident analysis; these are #41 and #42 (Butlers Passage), #83 Lichfield Square Car Park, New Invention and #131 Dover House, Providence Lane, Bloxwich.

However usage differs within cluster area depending on individual camera location. Most incidents (2626) were taken from, aptly numbered, Camera 007 The Bridge, the least used working camera is 132 Providence House, Bloxwich; recorded from once in March 2014. A small number of cameras have at some point ceased working (see Appendix 1 notes).

The year on year usage of cameras within broad clusters shows that overall incidents peaked in the middle 12 month period, but overall has remained fairly consistent over time, although overall usage in Brownhills appears to have declined over the last three years. **Table 2.**

When incidents are recorded from cameras, a category name code is assigned indicating a general reason for the incident. Across all cameras, and hence the borough, the top three reasons for incidence are Suspicion, Public Order and Anti-social Behaviour (ASB). **Table 3**.

The reason for Incidents differs overall within Custer and by individual camera. (see **Appendix 2** more detailed individual cluster analysis) but in summary the top three reasons by volume for Incident within each cluster are:

Most cameras have been recently used to record incidence footage; there are 25 cameras that haven't been used recently, i.e. during 2015. Noting that for 8 of these, this is where cameras are no longer in situ or functioning.

Of the remaining working cameras not recorded from recently;

- 5 fall within the Walsall Cluster, 2 within the town centre (#13 Goodall Street and #11 Lower Market), 3 in the Palfrey area (#113 Dale Street/Park, #112, Dale Street, # 116 New Mill Street
- 7 within Willenhall (#75 Rose Hill, #81 Wolverhampton Rd, #78 Parkes Street, #77 Tyler Road, #76 Harthill Street, #79 Tyler Gardens, # 72 Lower Lichfield Street)
- 1 in Brownhills(#54 Silver Street)
- 2 in Bloxwich (#147 Sandbank, #132, Providence House, #133 Cromwell House)

• 1 in Darlaston (#95 Mallows Close)

Mapping analysis


A series of maps containing mapped information have been produced, this helps assess whether cameras have been located in appropriate locations. The maps layer camera locations with three key datasets displayed as hotspot maps, at borough level (including fixed and domehawk locations) and enlarged scale for each of the camera cluster areas (fixed camera locations only).

The data plotted is;


- Incidence of Violence with Injury (VWI) and Incidence of Committed Crime (CC); both covering period June 2012 to May 2015; source Walsall LPU.
- Incidence of Anti-Social Behaviour from an all partner ASB dataset used for monthly area tasking for period Sept 2013 to May 2015; Source: Walsall Partnership, Area Tasking dataset.

Domehawk cameras are deployable cameras used since December 2010 to date to cover tasking hotspot areas. During this time there have been 205 deployments, covering 148 individual locations across the borough. (**Appendix 1b**)


Borough wide hotspot map of Violence with Injury (VWI)

This mapping shows that generally, the fixed cameras have, at borough level, been appropriately located within key hotspot areas. Inevitably, there will be some hotspot areas that are not covered with fixed cameras. However, there is also a good correlation between the domehawk cameras and hotspots not covered by fixed camera.


It is also important to note that given the three year period of data used to plot hotspots, some of the hotpots may have occurred 'a moment in time' and are hence historical. To understand these areas further would require more investigation of the data.

There follows a series of larger scale maps representing the hotspot data and fixed camera locations for each of the Camera Cluster areas.


These maps show in more detail that overall the locations of fixed cameras correlate well with core hotspot areas. Again where that is not the case, often these hotspots have at some point been covered by Domehawk Camera deployment.

More investigation might be beneficial to understanding the nature of issues within key hotspots to determine if the hotspots are covered well enough by the existing fixed camera network should locations change in the future.


Walsall South Area Partnership – Fixed and Domehawk camera locations




Walsall town Centre/ Palfrey/Caldmore cluster area Violence with Injury








Walsall North Area Partnership – Fixed and Domehawk camera locations






Shelfield/Rushall/Brownhills/Pelsall Area Partnership – Fixed and Domehawk camera locations




