TO: Children's & Young People Scrutiny & Performance Panel

DATE: 24 September 2009

RE: Local Area Agreement

Purpose

This briefing note informs the Panel of progress against the performance of the current Local Area Agreement (LAA) targets both at the end of 2008/09 and quarter 1 2009/10.

Background

At its first meeting of the municipal year the Panel received a presentation on Walsall Partnership's Business Plan and Local Area Agreement to assist in identifying items for inclusion in the Panel's work programme.

The Panel requested that the Partnership provide a quarterly report on performance against targets included in the Local Area Agreement which was signed-off by Ministers on 30 June 2008. The Panel would use the information contained to add to its work programme for 2009/10.

Appendix 1 sets out performance at the end of 2008/09 whilst appendix 2 highlights the current performance of the LAA in quarter 1 2009/10, with those indicators relevant to the Children's Scrutiny Panel listed in the final column.

Within the tables RAG ratings have been provided based on the latest position against the targets with additional comments giving background to the ratings.

The end of year (2008/09) position highlighted that there were no Red rated indicators, four Green, three Grey (where recent outturn data is currently unavailable) and one Amber which are of relevance to this Panel. For the quarter 1 2009/10 period this position has altered with there now being three Green, two Amber and three Red (Obesity primary school age children in Year 6, Proportion of Children in Poverty and Teenage Conceptions) rated indicators.

Members should note that since the periods of quarter 4 2008/09 to quarter 1 2009/10 the following targets have become red rated: Childhood Obesity, Proportion of Children in Poverty and Teenage Conceptions. Both the teenage conceptions and childhood obesity targets are acknowledged as having ambitious targets attributed to them as set by Government Office, whilst the Children in Poverty Indicator has been affected by the current economic downturn. In all instances each target lead has been requested to produce a Corrective Action Plan by the Children's and Performance Outcomes Group.
