Appointment of independent members to Standards Committee

Summary of report

This report seeks Members approval to appoint two independent members to the Standards Committee following retirement by rotation of two independent members previously appointed.

Recommendations

That Mr. Roy Meller and Mr. L Bates be appointed as independent members of the Standards Committee, for 3 years, until the end of the 2008/2009 municipal year.

Resource and legal considerations

Independent Members are entitled to reasonable out of pocket expenses such as travelling/subsistence/other related expenses. These are difficult to quantify in advance and will be dependent on the level of activity of the Standards Committee over their period of office. It is expected that they can be met from existing corporate budgets.

Equality implications

Independent Members have been recruited having regard to the Council's Equal Opportunities Policy and best practice in recruitment and selection procedures.

Independent members are bound by the Members code of conduct and as such are required to promote equality by not discriminating unlawfully against any person and by treating people with respect, regardless of their race, religion, gender, sexual orientation or disability.

Background

The Local Government Act 2000 and regulations thereunder require each authority to establish a Standards Committees of which 25% must be independent members (the Standards Committee consists of 4 elected members and 6 independent members). The selection of independent members should follow a public advertisement and appointment can only be made if they are approved by a majority of the members of the authority, are not related to or are a close friend of any Councillor or officer of the authority. Further they cannot have been a Member or officer of the authority in the preceding 5 years.

To ensure continuity and retention of experience the Standards Committee has agreed a system of retirement by rotation for independent members, such that the 2 longest serving members of the 6 would retire each year. Therefore it is suggested that these appointments be for a period of 3 years, until the end of the municipal year 2008/2009.

Process of Appointment

Public advertisements for the appointment of two independent members to the Standards Committee were placed in local and ethnic minority press, the Council's Job Shop publication, during the spring of 2006.

An interview panel comprising of Councillor Ansell and Councillor Chambers (nominee of Councillor Oliver) interviewed all applicants and following deliberation unanimously agreed to recommend to Council the appointment of the aforesaid applicants. Councillor Mrs. E.E. Pitt (nominee of Councillor I. Shires) was unable to attend the meeting but has confirmed she has no objection to the recommendation to Council.
