	The Forum noted that there were no items for consideration in the private session.	
7. 12.3.13	Feedback on Consultation of Scheme for Financing Schools	
	A report was submitted.	
	The Chairman referred to Paragraphs 6.2.1 and 6.2.2 and that independent advice had been sought on whether the governing body, rather than the Local Authority, made the decision regarding early retirement and associated costs.	
	Mr. Crowther referred to advice received to the following question:-	
	"If a 55+ member of the teaching profession was made redundant following due process, is there a legal responsibility to protect, to enhance that persons pension."	
	The response to the question was "no".	
	As a result of this and the confusion following the meeting in December, 2012, Mr. Crowther contacted Walsall Council Legal Services but they could not	

offer legal advice to Schools Forum as this would leave them in a compromised position.	
A discussion took place on the content of Paragraphs 6.2.1 and 6.2.2 and who would be responsible to pay premature retirement pension costs. Mr. Mortiboys confirmed that the Department for Education default position was that any appropriate payments be charged to the school and not to the Council.	
Mr. Mortiboys drew the Forum's attention to a report to the Forum in September, 2010 which appended the Teacher's Pension Regulations 1997 and the Teacher's (Compensation for Redundancy and Premature Retirement) Regulations, 1997, Part 4, relating to mandatory compensation. The Forum was informed that the Council had adopted that Regulation in respect of school closures, redundancy of teachers and compassionate grounds. This was agreed by Appointments Board and became Council policy.	
Mr. Crowther confirmed that the concerns of the Forum related to mandatory enhancement; Mr. Mortiboys confirmed that no enhancements were given beyond which was agreed by Appointments Board. Mr. Crowther stated that governing bodies should be informed that schools did not have to enhance payments.	
The Chairman stated that Paragraph 6.2.1 of the scheme did not make it clear who made the payment and whether governing bodies would be consulted. Mr. Mortiboys confirmed that the Local Authority policy clearly stated that the pension would not be actuarially reduced.	
Members referred to the change in policy in 2010 when the age that teachers could access their pension with early retirement was reduced from 58 to 55. At that time, it was advised that this was an equality issue but teachers and Local Government terms and conditions differed.	
It was suggested that the following question be put to the Council's Legal Services section and that the Chairman, Gary Crowther and Michelle Sheehy consider the response before the next meeting:-	

	 "Is there a legal entitlement for an employer (Local Authority, Academy or school) to protect, enhance or support a pension for someone who is made redundant at aged 55 years of age?" Mr. Mortiboys confirmed that pension enhancement was a discretionary provision.

Although some schools were moving away from balance control mechanism, it was felt that Walsall should retain this and move to an 8% retention maximum across the board and that schools would be required to notify the Local Authority by 31 st March if they were proposing to take their balance above 8% and give the reason for this.
