#### **School Ready Budget Update**

#### 1. Purpose of report

- 1.1 School's Forum request an annual update on their £250,000 investment into the School Ready budget (from 2015), designed to improve children's outcomes by the age of 5 years. The last time the report went to Schools Forum was March 2020. The plans and activity delivered through this investment reflect Walsall's corporate vision of reducing inequalities for children and maximising their potential by targeting money where it is needed most. Delivery of the plans always reflect the values of improving professionalism, leadership and accountability to ensure all provision is good or outstanding.
- 1.2 There is a particular focus on three priorities in 2021/22. The first priority is that all schools and settings will be aware of and ready to implement the Early Years Reforms. They will carry out deep reflection, develop their understanding of what the research into young children's learning states and develop an ambitious, sequential curriculum across the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) They will go on to implement change, evaluating and making further changes as necessary to ensure more children reach a good level of development. The second priority is to ensure gaps in educational achievement between the least and most deprived children will be narrowed for all under achieving groups: pupil premium, boys and SEN/D. The third priority is ensuring strong leadership and a highly skilled workforce across all sector types (schools, PVI groups and childminders).

#### 2. Recommendations

2.2 Schools Forum are asked to confirm if they approve with the plans for 2021/22. Schools Forum are also invited to add any further ideas or suggestions for ongoing improvement.

#### 3. Background

- 3.1 This report gives clear evidence to members that the £250,000 fund continues to be utilised well to deliver improved School Ready outcomes, aiming for 100% schools and settings to be judged as good or outstanding and for as many children to reach or stay at age related milestones as early in their development as possible.
- 3.2 In terms of the schools EYFS Ofsted grade, this remains nearly 4% above the national average. 93.1% of inspected Early Years school provision, in schools, is judged good or outstanding, compared to 88.6% National Average. Similarly, 96.9 % of Private, Voluntary or Independent (PVI) settings are good or outstanding settings compared to 96% National.
- 3.3 There has been no new data since the 2019 Profile Scores, where there was a slight rise in the numbers of children achieving their good levels of development in reading and writing but a decrease in all other areas.

3.4 Schools reported that this was due to the high numbers of SEN children compared to the 2018 cohort. Table 2 confirms the rise in the numbers of SEN children from 2018 to 2019 by nearly 1% (0.84%)

- 3.5 In terms of vulnerable group data, Table 3 demonstrates that Walsall is in line with national for children eligible free school meals (FSM) and is slightly above for deprived children achieving GLD. However, there is still a large percentage gap within Walsall between children eligible and not eligible for FSM by 14% and the deprived/ non-deprived gap is 13%. This clearly indicates that the continued focus for the LA is to close this gap. The gap between boys and girls attainment and autumn/ spring and summer born children continues to be a priority. The biggest concern is the gap between Walsall and National for children with SEN support needs.
- 3.6 In order to address the gaps above the training planned is rich in building children's cultural capital and focusses on improvement and strategies for all disadvantaged groups to include deprivation, SEND and boys. The Early Years Team also support and challenge schools and settings to have good outcomes for these groups of children. The team encourage schools and settings to apply for all additional funding to support each child. They also encourage strong partnership working.

- 3.7 School Forum fund continues to fund the training and projects for all provider types including academies, independent schools, private day care providers and childminders. Since the last report presented to Schools Forum in March 2020, School Ready funding has been used to deliver the following:
  - £6,400 Closing the Gap Conference, introducing national speaker Jean Gross through Language First to 8 more schools.
  - £1,250 Purchase of early talk packs.

The total spend for 2020/21 totals £7,650 which is shown in table 4 within section 5.0.

- 3.8 Some of the planned activity has not been delivered such as the maths training, outdoor learning and boys outcomes. The training providers for maths and boys learning were not able to deliver virtually at the time. The outdoor learning was due to be delivered on a school site but they were not allowing visitors in line with government Covid 19 protocol. They will all in the process of being re-commissioned.
- 3.17 The Early Implementer Innovator Grant is an additional non ring-fenced section 31 grant of £125k that was received in 2015/16 and rolled forward each subsequent year. Of the original amount, £75,618 was still available for 2020/21, and the following has already been spent this year:
  - £48,075 to fund a project with NASEN (National Association for Special Educational Needs).
  - £6,075 has been used to purchase 15 'Welcome' packs to gift to new settings.

The project with NASEN has been adapted to a virtual model over the pandemic and early feedback shows that the PVI group settings involved are more skilled and confident at identifying children's SEN, planning intervention, delivering on programmes and partnership working. Although this is not from the School Forum budget, it is important to note that the budgets runs alongside each other, maximising outcomes for children.

3.18 The Early Years Team have planned a programme of training and support for all provider types, up until the end of July 2022. It can either be delivered virtually or moved to face-to-face if necessary, and when safe to do so.

#### 4. Financial implications/Value for Money

- 4.1 Schools Forum Investment continues to be used in conjunction with the Early Innovator Grant and the central staff budget for Early Years Quality Assurance. Spreading the available funding over the last five years has ensured money is <u>only</u> invested following continued evaluation, analysis of data and revised training and projects based on current research and best practice.
- 4.2 The table below details year on year spend. The reduced spend in 2018/19 was due to more central funding being available which allowed for the teaching schools and SLE's delivering the programme to be funded centrally.
- 4.3 The decrease in spend for 2022/21 was due to the national pandemic.

#### 5. Proposal

- 5.1 The remaining School Ready Fund will be used to deliver the following training:
  - a) Early Talk Boost.
  - b) SMILE training
  - c) The Power of Parent Play training
  - d) Phonics.
  - e) Leading Outstanding Early Year's Practice.

- f) Using Wellcomm with children 0-3 & 3-5.
- g) Enhancing your Creative Curriculum
- h) Sons/Rhymes and Riddles
- i) Music, Children Telling their own Stories.
- j) Art.
- k) Using Non Fiction Books.
- I) Maths Graphics.
- m) Role Play.
- n) Forest School.
- o) Curious Conversations.
- p) Outdoor Learning.
- q) Celebrating the impact and outcomes of the Creative Curriculum.
- 5.2 Still to commission is external national training on literacy, maths and boys learning.

#### 6. Legal Implications

6.1 School Forum School Ready Fund supports the LA duty to ensure quality provision and improve outcomes for children particularly those who are vulnerable.

#### 7. School Improvement

- 7.1 Early Years leaders in schools and settings have adapted well to all change relating to the pandemic and have systems in place to assess Covid 19 risks and take appropriate actions to address/ minimise all concerns. All PVI group settings submitted a risk assessment after the first lockdown in order for the Early Years Team to identify and cascade ideas for best practice, rather than to sanction their effectiveness, as that responsibility lay with the management of the setting.
- 7.2 Although schools and settings have not been inspected this year the evidence from telephone, online and some face-to-face monitoring, by the Early Years Team, shows that they have continued to be able to deliver quality learning and care regardless of aspects of the EYFS being dis-applied at times. Many schools and settings delivered home learning in the first lockdown using ideas developed by the Early Years Team. By the second and third lockdowns many school settings had improved systems for online and virtual learning especially for reception aged children and in many case for children in nursery or twos provision.
- 7.3 The LA Early Years Team have continued to support schools and settings virtually through Microsoft team meetings and over the phone. Although there has been much demand for advice about government policy relating to the pandemic there has also been a continued focus on quality and outcomes for children.
- 7.4 New leaders training for school leaders and also for new PVI setting managers has been delivered by the EY's Team, with presentations from those completing their training arranged for this term. At the presentation events, new leaders will evidence the impact of their leadership and demonstrate how they have ensured good or outstanding outcomes for children.
- 7.5 Clear information about the new reforms have been shared with all headteachers via email and there are plans to deliver a short briefing in the summer term. EYFS leaders have already had a number of briefing sessions, emails, network meetings and training for all provider focusing on

the new Early Years Foundation Stage, Development Matters Framework, profile arrangements and closing the gap for all vulnerable groups.

- 7.6 Walsall has 42 schools who are Early Adopters of the reforms and they have had two extra training sessions where government training was shared along with 3 Walsall schools sharing their experiences, curriculums and ideas for assessment. This will be cascaded to all non –adopter schools and the PVI sector in the Summer Term.
- 7.7 Evidence from the inspections carried out before lockdown showed that where schools and setting were delivering 1000 stories in Early Years project, Ofsted were reporting favourably regarding young children's early reading experiences.
- 7.8 Two new focussed projects to promote communication and language and children's personal, emotional and social development have been developed in partnership between the LA and some school leaders. This has been delivered to all schools and settings. (SMILE/ The Power of Parent Play)

#### 8. Risk Management/ Risks

8.1 A key risk to achieving the objectives of this investment would be if the money was spent on activity that what not leading to impact. To minimise the risk all planned training, projects and courses are based on evidence-based practice and are evaluated to ensure their impact is worth the time and financial investment.

#### SAFEGUARDING TRAINING

All staff need to complete level 1 and level 2

Early Talk Boost is a targeted intervention aimed at 3-4 year old children with delayed language development helping to boost their language skills to help narrow the gap between them and their peers.

Our Evaluation Report shows that after *Early Talk Boost*, children make statistically significant progress in their early language. On average they make 6 months progress after a nine week intervention helping them to catch up with other children their age. This is twice the amount of progress of children not having the intervention.

#### Who is the Early Talk Boost intervention aimed at?

The Early Talk Boost intervention is designed for children aged 3-4 with delayed language development, typically those who have:

- -Difficulty listening/paying attention
- -Poor vocabulary
- -Difficulty understanding language
- -Difficulty organising and using language
- -Immature sentences
- -Difficulty explaining or describing
- -Difficulty taking turns

This means children who have intact language learning ability in themselves but for some reason haven't had the opportunity to develop age-appropriate language skills.

#### Can it be used as an intervention for children with English as an additional language?

At Fullbrook Nursery we have also used it as intervention for EAL learners, to enable them to have the confidence to begin learning and using English. The intervention had the biggest impact on those children who were age appropriate in their home language and less related to how much English they already spoke.

#### How is the group intervention delivered?

The intervention is delivered 3 times per week during circle/story time by a trained early years practitioner to a group of up to 8 children over a 9 week period. The intervention is supported by an initial training package and includes an *Early Talk Boost* Tracker to help identify appropriate children for the intervention and to measure their progress. The intervention also includes a workshop for parents/carers to enable them to develop children's communication and language skills at home.

#### How do parents get involved?

In order to increase the impact of the intervention and support sustainable future progress, the training will provide practitioners with everything they need to engage parents, including workshop materials and story books to share at home. Parents are supported to understand key Top Tips for sharing books (not necessarily reading them) in order to make a difference to their child's language development.

#### Who is Early Talk Boost training for?

Early Talk Boost training is for early years practitioners working with groups of 3-4 year olds in early years settings.
