- (1) That the corporate budget plan (revenue and capital) set out in the report and its appendices be noted.
- (2) That it be noted that consultation is ongoing with trade unions and employees in respect of savings options which have a staffing implication.
- (3) That at the time of despatch of this report, the precepting authorities (fire and police) had not formally notified the authority of their final council tax increases, so these will be provided for the Council meeting of 23 February 2009. Current estimates have been used within this report based on informal communication from each precepting authority.

- (4) That it be noted that the Walsall Council draft net budget requirement for 2009/10 is £237.194m, resulting in a band D Council tax of £1,332.66; a weekly increase of between £0.64p and £0.95p for the 92.37% of Walsall residents in bands A D properties as detailed in Annex 16
- (5) That on the basis set out in (3) above, the provisional (i.e.: subject to formal confirmation) overall Council tax increase would be 3.8%, including estimated precepts, resulting in a total band D council tax of £1,477.54.
- (6) That the recommendations of the Chief Finance Officer (CFO) in respect of the robustness of the estimates made for the purposes of the budget calculations and the adequacy of reserves as set out in Annex 9 of the corporate budget plan be noted.
- (7) That delegated authority be given to the Chief Finance Officer to make any necessary amendments to this resolution, in consultation with the Cabinet member for Finance and Personnel, to take account of the final levies and precepts which have not yet been notified and to make any necessary amendments to the statutory determinations to take account of those changes and the resulting final analysis of the budget for 2009/10 and for that amended resolution to be submitted to Council at its meeting of 23 February 2009.

 - (a) Replace saving number 164 Annex 5 (agency savings housing £45,657) with restructure of management within residential homelessness projects.
 - (b) Replace £150,000 of saving number 115 Annex 5 (agency savings regeneration) with WNF funding in 2009/10 and 2010/11.
 - (c) Replace £106,000 of saving number 46 Annex 5 (agency savings neighbourhood services) with a reduction of 9 permanent posts and an increase in 9 summer agency employees.
 - (d) The revised draft capital programme reserve list Annex 13
- (3) (a) That the net levies for outside bodies be noted.
