## **Funding Update**

### Purpose of the Report

This report seeks to inform the Local Neighbourhood Partnership of the progress to date with regards to the funding priorities 2005-2006.

#### Recommendations

- 2. Identify 3 sites from the 5 put forward by the CAG for dog fouling bins.

#### **Progress on active projects**

#### Landscape Feature on Ryders Hayes/Norton Road

This project has now been completed.

### Dog Fouling Awareness Campaign

£600 has been allocated towards dog fouling bins in the LNP area. The following sites have been recommended by the CAG.

Highfield Road North Rowley Place near Daw End School Entrance Ryders Hayes Lane Wood Lane near North Common Cartbridge Lane/Lichfield Road

#### **Green house Project**

This project will be delivered in partnership with Groundwork Black Country who will alongside Street Pride attend all five primary schools in the area and educate school pupils about the food chain, healthy eating, composting and recycling.

### Rushall Olympic Football Club Sign

The LNP agreed this project at the last meeting pending a breakdown of costs. The breakdown of costs has been requested awaiting further information.

The sign would be black writing upon a white background and would be located on an existing lamppost column opposite Dales Lane. The sign would comply with TSRGD 2002 and would have a lead in time of six weeks to manufacture the sign. It is proposed to allocate the remaining LNP 2005-2006 towards the sign with the rest to be met by the Rushall Olympic Football Club. The total cost of the sign will be £1,200.00 and the LNP contribution will be £441.40.

A project proposal has been put forward by the Safer Stronger CAG to have a recycling base in the LNP area. Costings for this project have been requested, currently awaiting for these.
