Addendum to West Midlands Fire and Rescue Authority Governance Consultation Report

1.0 Purpose

- 1.1 That this addendum report be noted alongside the main report 'West Midlands Fire Authority Governance Review Consultation' before Cabinet.
- 1.2 The purpose of the report is to provide Cabinet with an update of the outcomes of an additional 30 completed consultation surveys that were received through the post following the close of the consultation.

2.0 Addendum Detail

- 3.1 The West Midlands Fire Authority ran a public consultation from the 11th January to the 8th March. The results were collated, evaluated and a report provided to seven West Midlands Councils on the 12th March. A further 30 completed surveys were then received after the 12th March.
- 3.2 The West Midlands Fire Authority considers that these responses should beaccepted due to the likelihood that the surveys were submitted and received at its offices before the consultation deadline and the delay in reaching the West Midlands Combined Authority may have been due to postal delivery.
- 3.3 Below is a tables (Table 1) showing the outcome of consultation as previously published, the outcome only taking into account the thirty late responses, and latest outcome incorporating all responses with the changes highlighted.
- 3.4 In summary by incorporating the additional thirty responses the changes to responses to the five questions posed about the proposed changes are:
 - Proposed Governance Arrangements: Strongly Disagree/Disagree down 1% from 41% to 40%.
 - Role of Fire Advisory Committee: Neither Agree or Disagree up 1% from 6% to 7%, and Strongly Disagree/Disagree down 1% from 33% to 32%.
 - Chief Fire Officer to be accountable to the Mayor: Strongly Agree/Agree up 1% from 54% to 55 %.
 - Lead to a more joined up and focused service: Don't Know up 1% from 3% to 4%.
 - Meets the Secretary of State's Key Tests: Strongly Disagree/Disagree down 1% from 42% to 41% and Don't Know up 1% from 4% to 5%.

In respect of the demographic profiles of respondents, there is no significant change from the original published outcomes (Table 2).


