- audit findings

CURRENT POSITION

- currently overall reported crime stands at 26,695 per ann
- this is a 16.25% reduction over the 2002 – 2005 strategy period against a target of 14.24%



AUDIT FINDINGS - PRIORITIES

- drugs / alcohol
- prostitution
- young people perpetrators and victims
- anti social behaviour
- acquisitive crime



- 54% of residents say that drugs is a big problem
- around 1560 problematical drug users in the borough
- cost of drug crime in Walsall around £53m per ann

DRUGS

- good at getting people into treatment
- well below national average in tackling supply problems

ALCOHOL

high levels of alcohol related crime –
 5205 incidents last year

 75% of police cases in town centre at weekends are alcohol related

PROSTITUTION

particular concerns in some LNP areas

drugs paraphernalia

YOUNG PEOPLE

- 64% of residents felt that YP causing a nuisance/hanging around was a big problem
- youth crime 7% of all crimes committed
- 18% of YP admit to regularly carrying weapons

YOUNG PEOPLE

- 21% of referrals to victim support were young people
- safe areas to hang out all weather play/sports areas and ongoing activities



ANTI SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

 violent crime represents 18.4% of all crime in Walsall

violence against the person (5205 incidents)

 criminal damage represents 17.5% of all crime

ANTI SOCIAL BEHAVOUR

 64% of residents say vandalism, graffiti and other deliberate damage is a big problem



ANTI SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

 vehicle crime represents 24% of all crime in Walsall but is going down

robbery (against the person) is 1.5% of all crime

 burglary dwelling is 7% of all crime but is going down




