Formation of political groups and appointments on Committees

Summary of report

This report informs the Council of the composition of political groups making up the Council. The report explains the political balance on Council Committees consistent with the provisions of the Local Government (Committees and Political Groups) Regulations 1990 (as amended). The report also sets out the nominations to Committees as supplied by political groups.

Recommendations

- (1) That the Council notes the receipt of returns from political groups.
- (2) That members be appointed to serve on Committees for the municipal year 2005/2006 as set out in the attached schedule.

2. Councillor Bott does not belong to any political group and is referred to as an independent member.

Ratio for allocation of Committee seats

- 3. The allocation of Council Committee places must be made in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government and Housing Act, 1989. Achieving political balance is a complex process which requires a compromise to be made between sets of calculations. This can result in marginal differences which may be significant to Committee representation of individual political groups. The required "balance" has to be achieved by the Council allocating seats on individual Committees to properly constituted political groups based on the size of each group in relation to the size of the Council and so far as is reasonably practicable at the same time the total number of seats allocated to each group across all Committees must be in the same proportion.
- 4. These calculations are rarely exact, but in seeking to ensure all if the Council seeks to ensure that all political groups are dealt with fairly, this report implements the requirements of the relevant legislation.
- 5. The Council is open to legal challenge if it was thought not to have used its best endeavours to achieve "so far as reasonably practicable" a position where the allocation of seats reflects the political make-up of the Council. The final decision necessary to achieve political balance lies with the Council and officers have worked to bring forward to Council clear recommendations to achieve the intentions of the legislation.
- 5. On the basis of the political groups the allocation of seats on Committees must be calculated in the ratio of 36 : 16: 6: 1: reflecting the size of the groups on the Council, together with one vacancy which is the subject of a by-election to be held on 9th June 2005.
- 6. The declared Political Groups will be asked for nominations to the allocated places in accordance with their numerical strength as recorded in their returns to the Chief Executive.
- 7. At the time of writing this report, the allocation of seats on Committees remain the same as for the municipal year 2004/2005 despite the small change in membership.

8. However, following the by-election on 9th June 2005, there will be the need to re-calculate the political balance.
