### 49. Mayor's announcements

### **Death of former Councillor Alan Davies**

#### Resolved

That this Council expresses its regret at the death of Mr. A.G. Davies a member of Walsall Metropolitan Borough Council from 1978 to 1999 and Mayor in 1991/92 and places on record their appreciation of his services to the borough over a period of many years and expresses its condolences to his family at this sad time.

Members and officers stood in silence as a mark of respect.

#### Resolved

- (1) That the content of the petition be noted.
- (2) That it be noted that edgings and flower beds are permitted on adult lawn graves as per section 6.9d) of the rules and regulations, approved by Cabinet on 15 June, 2016, namely; 'Any additional memorial in the form of a surround will not extend beyond 610mm (24" from the head end of the grave space or beyond the width of the grave space nor be of a height greater than 100mm (4")
- (3) That the decision by Cabinet on 15th June 2016 regarding the procedure that will be used where there is non-compliance of the rules and regulations in particular unauthorised memorials be noted.

# 55. Visionary Investment Enhancing Walsall Ltd. (VIEW) – governance proposals

Councillor Hughes left the room during consideration of the item.

The report was submitted.

It was **moved** by Councillor D. Coughlan, seconded by Councillor S. Coughlan and:

#### Resolved

- (1) That the change of governance arrangements for Visionary Investment Enhancing Walsall Ltd and its Board requested by whg through a variation to part 2.1.2.2 of the 15<sup>th</sup> Schedule (Part II VAT Sharing Agreement of the Stock Transfer Agreement dated 22 March, 2003 be approved as follows:
  - (a) Reducing membership of the VIEW Board from 15 members to 12 members, thus reducing Council nominations from 5 to 4 members;
  - (b) Rewording of the 'charitable objectives' to meet the Charity Commission for England and Wales definition;
  - (c) Removal of the wording: 'the Charity [VIEW] will not be under the control of the Parent [whg] and any of the other Companies' and replacing with 'the Charity's day to day activities will be controlled by the Board, subject to the Charity's status as a subsidiary of the Parent'.
- (2) That it be noted that the number of Council Senior Officers on the VIEW Board will be reduced from 2 to 1;
- (3) That Council delegates authority to the Head of Business Change, to negotiate and agree the final terms of the Deed of Variation to be entered into with whg to record the changes as set out above.
