# **De-delegation of Music Service funding**

A report was submitted.

Mr. Mortiboys referred to a discussion he had prior to the meeting with Mr. Howkins (E.F.A.) when it was pointed out that the Music Service in Walsall was unique and this could be funded by top slicing school budgets rather than de-delegation. This would not cost schools any money as it would be a continuation of the arrangements for 2012/13. He confirmed that all Members of the Forum could vote on this matter.

### **Resolved** (Unanimously)

That Schools Forum approve a one year agreement to enable top slicing from the budget of all schools benefiting from the service and note that this would be a continuation of support for the service as that provided in 2012/13.

Mr. Mortiboys outlined the content of the report and drew attention to the guidance and the scheme for financing schools set out in Paragraph 2. He confirmed that a further report would be submitted to the meeting in February, 2013 and suggested that a small Working Group be set up to discuss proposed changes to the schemes in line with national policy. Mr. Mortiboys informed the Forum that the funding held by the Council would decrease as more schools transferred to Academies; the funding formed part of the schools budget some years ago but the Council had continued to fund premature retirement costs which were charged annually as a pension top up. In accordance with DfE advice, the Council would not continue to take up these costs. He confirmed that the charges against schools would relate to new premature retirements.

Mr. Bragger referred to the burden this would place on small schools and it would worsen their budgetary situations.

Mr. Howkins informed the Forum that the proposed changes to the scheme were in accordance with legislation contained within the 2002 Education Act, redundancy costs would be borne by the Local Authority and premature retirement charges would fall to the relevant school.

After discussion it was.
