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Background

At the Standards Committee meeting on 30 October 2008, the Committee received a report on the Freedom of Information Act which detailed a review of activity relating to the Act during the financial year 2007/08.

The review indicated that the number of requests for information made during this period had increased by around 25%, which was seen as an ongoing trend. The report also indicated that the complexity of requests was increasing partly due to the use of the Act by journalists from the national/local/trade press.

Following a full discussion, the Committee resolved that a "letter be sent to central government asking for a change in the law so that fixed charges may be put against information requests which were to be used for commercial gain". This was sent to the Director General and Chief Legal Advisor on 23 December 2008 and is attached as Appendix 1.

On 26 January 2009 a letter was received in response from the Head of Information Policy Decision. This is attached as Appendix 2.
