Purpose of the report:	As requested by schools forum, this report gives details on the final account for the Transforming Learning programme
Recommendations:	Schools Forum notes the report.

- 1. Background
 - 1.1. Building Schools for the Future aimed to rebuild and renew all secondary schools in England. Walsall was in Wave 6a of the project, and had completed the Strategy for Change 2 (SFC2) stage of the project and was working towards the Outline Business Case (OBC)
 - 1.2. The BSF project was put on hold by Michael Gove, the Education Secretary, in July 2010.
 - 1.3. Work on the project was brought to an immediate halt and all partners were asked to submit final bills to the authority.
- 2. Expenditure
 - 2.1. The table below summarises in detail the cash expenditure on the BSF project:

The interest has to date been £23,374. There will be a final calculation once funds have been paid across and this will be distributed as requested by Schools Forum. The DSG calculations appear to shows £5,581 that has not been used by BSF or distributed. It is proposed that once this has been fully verified that this will be distributed with the interest.

- 4. Reimbursement of funds
 - 4.1. Had BSF gone ahead there were significant costs that could have been capitalised against the assets to be created. However with the demise of BSF the Audit Commission produced a ruling dictating that no costs could be capitalised, therefore all spend is taken from the revenue funding.
 - 4.2. Splitting the revenue reimbursement per original funding gives reallocations as follows:
