Area Manager's Report

Tuesday 31st March 2015

1. **Purpose of the Report**

- 1.1 This report seeks to inform Elected Members for the North Walsall Area Partnership of some of the work carried out within the local area.
- 1.2 North Walsall has a number of key priorities which have been identified through work with partner agencies, Walsall Intelligence Network and the local community.
- 1.3 The strategic priorities are:
 - Safer Walsall: Creating safe, sustainable and inclusive communities
 - Children and Young People: Improving safeguarding, learning and life chances for children and young people
 - Business and Jobs: Supporting businesses to thrive and supporting local people in to work
 - Health and Well-Being: Improving health, including well-being and independence for older people
- 1.4 There are monthly Non Confidential Tasking & Co-ordination (Partner) Meetings that occur in North Walsall. The meetings provide the opportunity for partner agencies to come together and share ideas, information and co-ordinate strategy based on the Walsall Plan.

The partners include: Community Safety Services (ASB Team), Young Support Services, West Midlands Police, residents, Ward Councillors, Reedswood Park Retailers, Stephenson Square Retailers, Walsall Housing Group (WHG), Caldmoreaccord Housing, Walsall Association of Tenant Management Organisations, West Midlands Probation Service, Walsall Intelligence Network, Environmental Health, Beechdale Community Housing, Mirus Academy, Frank F Harrison Community Association, St Aiden's Care Team, North Walsall Area Partnership, Walsall Adult Community College (WACC), Walsall College, Economic Regeneration Team, Work on the Horizons, Prospects, Public Health, Lifestyles Team, Forest Arts Centre, Blakenall Community Centre (BCC), Ryecroft Hub, Green Lane Baptist Church & Community Payback.

2. Safer Walsall: Creating safe, sustainable and inclusive communities

- 2.1 Inspector Jacqueline Nicholson and her team are undertaking further proactive policing across North Walsall. There are monthly focussed approaches undertaken by the police to tackle issues including those linked to child exploitation (safeguarding) and modern day slavery (human trafficking).
- 2.2 The police continue to support crime reduction and are in the process of finalising the new policing priorities that are to be set for 2015/2016. There will be continued action to reduce crime, fear of crime, keeping roads safe and increasing confidence in the police and partners to tackle crime.

The police have been working with Bloxwich retailers to develop measure to deter crime. One of the measures will be the introduction of 'linked radios', where retailers will be able to speak to each other to prevent offences and notify the police of any activities that may require their presence.

Criminal Behaviour Orders are being investigated for well-known offenders, with a view to possibly excluding them from certain areas in North Walsall.

- 2.3 Beechdale Community Housing Association are supporting the residents and local community in tackling anti-social behaviour. There has been support to tenants who are causing a concern through their ASB activities and various interventions have been implemented, supported across the partnership. The next Beechdale ASB meeting is scheduled for Friday 27th March 2pm BCH Offices.
- 2.4 Colin Isham & Walsall College are rolling out a course linked to EU Gangs & tackling gang cultures. The course offers a Community Safety qualification. For further information contact **Colin Isham**; EUGangs Lead; Tel 07415 029373
- 2.5 A pollination of green spaces is occurring across the borough. Led by Alison Bate, Strategic Development Officer, the project aims to identify appropriate green spaces and then work with local partners and agencies to encourage the space to be used by wildlife. Beechdale Community Housing is involved with identifying green spaces, supported by the BEES Environmental group for the estate.
- 2.6 Vernon Way in Bloxwich has been subject to off-road bikes and other vehicles gaining access to the green space by Glastonbury Crescent. With the support of the Area Partnership funding barriers are to be installed on 17th March 2015 to deter such actions.

- 2.7 Commercial waste continues to be dumped in Goscote Lodge Crescent and Slackey Lane. Arrangements have been made to clear the rubbish and debris. The fly-tipping seems to occur on a weekly basis. Senior Officers have met with in WMBC and further action is to be taken to deter these actions.
- 2.8 Along Hawbush Road fencing has been installed by the 'curly whirly bridge'. The fencing is to address a long-standing ASB issues.
- 2.9 Cameras are deployed in different locations across North Walsall to tackle flytipping, anti-social behaviour and to assist with the detection of criminal activities.

Covert cameras are also utilised. The distributions of cameras are decided at the monthly Confidential Partnership Tasking & Co-ordination Meeting.

3. Children and Young People: Improving safeguarding, learning and life chances for children and young people

- 3.1 Youth Support Service, Frank F Harrison and Blakenall Community Centre are co-ordinating activities with the support of Community Safety and Area Partnership.
- 3.2 YSS developed activities over Feb. ½ term period, with 78 young people across North Walsall worked with as part of the detached youth work sessions. Beechdale and Birchills young people undertook a mixed cultural football sessions and the learning from that was the young people felt that they can work well together.

- 3.3 Youth Support Service are reviewing various exit strategies from different projects that have been operating in North Walsall, as the service is being reduced.
- 3.4 Youth Support Service are undertaking various surveys with young people on how they see the service being developed in future years. This includes speaking with young people in Birchills regarding youth provision.
- 3.5 A full-time worker has left Mossley Youth Centre & WMBC on 03/03/2015. This means that the Youth Support Service are reduced by 1 full-time worker; however the part-time staff are covering the sessions, supported by other senior full-time staff.
- 3.6 Youth Support Service is promoting a 'No Means No' campaign- linked to sexual health, relationships and well being.
- 3.7 Plans have been developed to engage young people over the Easter period.

4. Business and Jobs: Supporting business to thrive and supporting local people into work

- 4.1 Goscote Regeneration Group has been meeting with residents over the last few months. The aim is to enable residents to have input into the Keepmoat housing activities. The next meeting is 24th March Ryecroft Centre, New Forest Road, Blakenall, 5.00pm- 6.30 pm.
- 4.2 Jason Fry is the newly appointed Engagement Officer for whg. He is seeking to further develop the local apprenticeships that are available to young people in the area. There are also opportunities for electrical companies to be involved.

Recruitment for the courses, starting in April, will target plumbing; June onwards targeting all sectors. The apprenticeships are not solely for whg tenants and the work is linked to Walsall Works (16-24 age range).

He is also looking to support and develop 'ready to work' programmes for adults. If you know of any interested organisations/partners please forward Jason's information onto them.
