Partnership Plan Review workshops

Following the recent workshops, the LNP have formed the following actions and Pledges for 2006-2007. This includes the actions which were suggested to be forwarded from the current plan.

Local Area Agreement (LAA) pillar: Healthier Communities and Vulnerable People

Pledge: Promote and raise awareness of elderly activities available in the LNP area encouraging them to be participate.

Problems:

- Lack of funding for the elderly for recreational and social purposes
- More provision required for the nifty fifty
- Lack of transport to enable the elderly
- Activities required that would incorporate exercise and promote independent living

What the LNP will do:

- Raise awareness of current social and recreational provision. This will be done by
 - Undertaking a mapping exercise of current provision
 - Promoting current provision through various innovative formats
 - Identify gaps in provision
 - Consult elderly people where there are gaps in provision of what services they would like
 - Find support to cater for the new demand in activities where gaps have been identified.
- Ensure suitable transport links are available to locations
- Look at provision for the support available for carers to attend social and recreational activities

Pledge: Promote awareness of Sexually Transmitted Diseases STD's

Problems:

- Increase in sexual transmitted diseases
- Sexual transmitted diseases impact on all residents of all ages
- There has been an increase of STD's in older people
- The teenage pregnancy rate is twice the national average in the LNP area

What the LNP will do:

- Raise awareness of STD's for parents and young people
 - o Highlight dangers involved
 - Use shock tactics and graphic photos
 - Use the media to send out a strong and clear message
- Link to other schools outside the LNP area which are Young People in the LNP attend to promote greater awareness of STD's
- Raise young people's aspirations
- Link into NDC's plans of developing a Young People's Information Centre regarding services that affect them and ensure the services that are available in the centre are acceptable to them.
- Promote the use of Chlamydia tests
- Link with the current work being undertaken with teenage pregnancy

Local Area Agreement (LAA) pillar: Safer Stronger Communities

Pledge: Look to sustain funding for current community and voluntary organisations

Problems:

- Lack of funding for community associations and neighbourhood resource centres
- Potential risk of closure of community venues and facilities
- Increase of crime and anti-social behaviour
- Impact on Adult Education courses

What the LNP will do:

- Utilise Community and Voluntary organisations in the new LAA commissioning role
- Seek support from the External Funding Unit for funding applications
- Support Community Associations and other voluntary organisations to develop Business Plans.
- Utilise community associations and other Voluntary facilities more effectively.

Pledge: To improve the grass verges in the LNP area

Problems:

- Cars parking on grass verges and destroying the grass
- Increased congestion on roads
- Unsuitable parking available
- LNP area presents a poor image

What the LNP will do:

- Mapping activity of hot spot areas
- Improve enforcement levels in the LNP area
- Where appropriate use interventions such as bollards and fencing
- Encourage schools to undertake school travel plans
- Review current car parking provision in the LNP area

Pledge: To promote and increase the level of recycling

Problems:

- Low levels of recycling
- Landfill Allowance Trading Scheme (LATS) targets
- Problem with the bins not being user friendly, can be too heavy for elderly

What the LNP will do:

- More promotional material in the LNP area regarding services available
- User friendly promotional material required
- Promote recycling in schools, encourage children who in turn will take the message back home to their parents
- More awareness of the reasons behind recycling where there is low uptake
- Door knocking of residents not using the kerbside recycling scheme to discuss issues.

Local Area Agreement (LAA) pillar: Children and Young People

Pledge: To increase activities for Children and Young People in the LNP area

Problems:

- Lack of activities for Young People
- Young people congregating in groups which causes concerns for other residents such as fear of crime
- Large number of young people not aware of what is available for them

What the LNP will do:

- Create a baseline of current provision of activities available for Young People. This will be done by undertaking a mapping exercise of current provision using young people form the LNP area.
- Develop a Children's and Young Peoples directory for the LNP and promote current provision through various innovative formats
- Identify gaps in provision and seek to improve them
