9.	a) Resolution of Cabinet following the Strategic Review of Community Association funding – Report of the Community Organisation Leisure and Culture Scrutiny and Performance Panel. Cabinet Wednesday, March 22, 2006 (1) That Cabinet thanks the Community Organisation, Leisure	

and Culture Scrutiny Panel for the work that it has done on this review. This is an example of scrutiny working productively and helpfully on important issues. (2) That Cabinet supports a number of recommendations. In particular recommendations 1, 3, 4, 5 and 7 reflect very much the way it is hoped that the community associations will develop in the future. (3) That Cabinet endorses wholeheartedly the focus of the scrutiny panel on the need for quality control and for community associations to establish stronger links with local neighbourhood partnerships. Governance arrangements regarding funding have never been stronger or as important (4) That Cabinet reaffirms its decision of only funding activities that meet the criteria of Transforming Youth Work and insisting on quality provision from trained youth workers, which has paid off and resulted in the very positive feedback received from the Government Office for the West Midlands. (5) That Cabinet requests community associations to consider the two key challenges which face them: firstly to address the historic over reliance on council funding for those services, beyond the statutory youth service, which they wish to provide, and secondly to demonstrate the real impact of their activity in local communities. The Council is now entering a Local Area Agreement with the government, which sets out demanding targets for improvements in the local economy, health and children's services and for creating safer, stronger communities. The focus must be on the things that really make a difference in these areas and all community associations are invited to consider how their activities from now on can really contribute to help meet these demanding targets. 10.
