## RE: Exam Results

## Summary

The summary of results is based on early information from self reporting data from schools.

Foundation stage
Good progress has been made particularly in Communication Language and Literacy 7\% increase from 2008 which has been a major focus to improve language development at Foundation Stage. Personal social and emotional development increased by 10\% and youngsters achieving Point 6 (national target in both areas rose by 7\%)
Performance within the super output areas continues to improve and the gap between the lowest performing $20 \%$ of pupils in the Local authority has narrowed from 37.2 to 34.0.

## Key Stage One

Progress at Key Stage One continues to improve and has seen the gap narrow in writing and reading. Reading at Level two is now at a National average. There will be a continued focus on reading and the link between early language acquisitions further developed.

## Key Stage Two

Attainment at L4 Mathematics remained at $79 \%$ and continues to match the national average. Attainment at L4 Science remains at $87 \%$ and again in line with the national average.
There has been a drop of 3\% in English in 2009 at 77\%. However there has been a drop nationally of $1 \%$ and many schools are still awaiting the outcome of remarked papers. At Key Stage Two children are performing well in relation to 2 level progress achieving above national average in both English and Mathematics.

## Key Stage Three

This is the first year that SATs have not been administered nationally and the results received from schools are based on either optional SATs or teacher assessments. Indicators show good progress in all subjects. English L5 increase 3\%, Maths L5 increase $5 \%$, Science increase 5\%

## Key Stage four

Whilst invalidated data, early indication shows a $5 \%$ increase in $5 A^{*}-C$ and $3.4 \%$ increase in 5A-C in English and Mathematics
Considering the substantial gains in 2007-08 there has therefore been $13.5 \%$ increase in
5A-C from 2007-08 - 2008=09 and an 8.3\% increase in 5A-C in English and Mathematics over the same two year period
