### **Update on Universal Infant Free School Meals Funding**

## 1. Purpose of report

1.1 To provide schools forum with an update on the current position regarding capital funding for the implementation of Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM), and the outcome of the recent further requests for funding that have been received from schools.

#### 2. Recommendations

- 2.1 That Schools Forum note the current position regarding funding and endorses the requests for funding that have been approved by the working group.
- 2.2 That approval of any further requests to utilise the remaining funding are delegated to the working group (with updates provided to Schools Forum).

## 3. Background

- 3.1 Schools Forum agreed on 10 March 2015 to a further round of bids from maintained non VA primary schools to seek to utilise the remaining UIFSM capital funding that had been received by the authority, which, as an initial round of bidding for funding was completed during 2014 to support schools to implement UIFSM, and due to their being a limited amount of funding remaining, would be prioritised as follows:
  - 1. Schools who are still unable to offer hot meals
  - 2. Schools who were not successful in receiving any financial support in the first round of bidding
  - 3. Schools who are now experiencing health and safety or other legislative issues in connection with operating the UIFSM offer
  - 4. Schools who are experiencing operational difficulties issues in connection with operating the UIFSM offer
- 3.2 Schools Forum also agreed that bids would be reviewed and agreed by a working group comprising:
  - Assistant Director Access & Achievement (or nominee)
  - Head of Educational Standards and Improvement (or nominee)
  - Senior Finance Manager Schools (or nominee)

- Chair of Schools Forum (or nominee)
- Chair of PNS (or nominee)
- 4.6 Once bids had been received a working group of the members who were available met on 2 October 2015 to review submissions.

# 5. Outcome of Bidding Process

5.1 A summary of the bids received, the outcome of the review of the working group, and explanation of any variance in funding requested and funding allocated is set out in the table below:

- 5.2 The value of bids that have been agreed above would leave a remaining UIFSM capital grant balance of circa £50k. Since the bids were evaluated one further school has contacted the Schools Finance team to set out that they were unable to meet the deadline for bids but were experiencing significant operational difficulties in the UIFSM offer at their school.
- 5.3 To ensure that schools continuing to experience difficulties can be supported, and the available funding is fully utilised, it is recommended that approval of any further requests to utilise the remaining funding are delegated to the working group (with updates provided to Schools Forum).

## 6. Financial implications/Value for Money

6.1 Any bids that are approved need to be contained within the financial resources that are available to support UIFSM implementation (as set out in the report).

### 7. Legal Implications

7.1 Only maintained non VA primary schools are eligible to bid for this funding (Academy and VA schools received funding to support the implementation of UIFSM separately).

### 8. School Improvement

8.1 The bids that this funding will support should ensure that all schools are able to effectively deliver their UIFSM offer, and aid schools in achieving Walsall's aim of doing all that it can to ensure that schools are able to serve a hot meal as part of this.

### 9. Members eligible to vote

9.1 All elected members with voting rights are eligible to vote on this matter.
