The basis of these negotiations will be to develop a threeyear outcomes-based grant arrangement with One Walsall from 1 April 2019, with a Council contribution of £170,000.

Summary of item considered in private session

3851 Land at Hatherton Street

- (1) Cabinet approved the disposal of the Council's freehold interest in the land provided:
 - (i) the sale price satisfies the requirement to achieve best consideration;
 - (ii) the transaction does not reach legal completion until the purchaser has obtained detailed planning permission from the Local Planning Authority for the proposed development;
 - (iii) the Council undertakes the preparation and remediation of the site, including all necessary consents.
- (2) Cabinet delegated authority to the Executive Director for Economy and Environment in consultation with the Cabinet Portfolio Holder for Regeneration to approve the final terms for the disposal.
- (3) Cabinet approved the pre-disposal works (set out in section 3.13) and associated estimated costs (set out in section 6.2) to be undertaken to support the disposal and to be funded from the land receipt and the existing Regenerating Walsall capital programme.
- (4) Cabinet approved feasibility/ business case work to be undertaken as set out in section 3.14 and to be funded from existing revenue reserves within the Economy and Environment Directorate.

(5) Cabinet recommended Council to approve an amendment to the Capital Programme (approved 28 February 2018) to include a budget for predisposal works to support the sale.
