Further to receipt of the application to vary the DPS to Melanie Jordan, West Midlands Police do have concerns. I therefore arranged a site visit with the agent and Melanie to discuss further which occurred on Monday. I do believe this was a very positive meeting and I will be writing to the agent and Melanie to outline what was agreed and a way forward.

However, it was very disappointing to evidence on their CCTV that during the time Melanie has been the Premise Licence Holder, breaching of their trading hours have been allowed to happen. Myself and Sarah Heath-Marshall viewed their CCTV on 28<sup>th</sup> July, 1<sup>st</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> August. Unfortunately it was in a room with no lights so it was very difficult to make clear notes in the dark. However, on the 1<sup>st</sup> August customers where seen in the outside area holding drinks and food until 04.49 with the last ones being ushered out by door staff at 04:59. The premises should have been closed to the public at 04:30. On the 8<sup>th</sup> people inside at 04:46. Again during the dates viewed, the door to the premises was opened on a number of occasions to let people in outside of their normal trading hours and some of the staff including door staff with their guests/partners were allowed to remain on the premises to continue drinking. At these times the blind to the front door has remained open. West Midlands Police also have concerns with Derek Minott being associated and playing a part running this business, Derek is Melanie's partner. It has been evidenced his poor management at a recent hearing in Wolverhampton where he was the DPS. During a Licencing Subcommittee hearing on 25<sup>th</sup> April 2018 the committee was satisfied on the evidence that:

- 1. There had been significant breaches of the licence conditions and failure to comply with provisions of the Licensing Act.
- 2. 2. Search procedures were inadequate.
- 3. There had been serious crime on the premises (wounding) and it was likely other criminal activity had occurred on the premises to include allowing patrons to smoke and use drugs.

West Midlands Police have also a number of reported incidents relating to this venue and it was due to this information that I contacted the DPS to be told she had left two weeks ago, hence this application.

With all of the above noted, both Sarah and I have agreed to work with Melanie and a number of measures have been agreed. The town safe radio will be provided to them for 6 months and the payment details after this time provided to them. Further licensing checks will be made and their CCTV checked to ensure no further breaches are evidenced. They have already changed their door staff so the after-hours drinking with staff and guests will cease. As pointed out to them, door staff are employed to work for them at quite a cost, it's not a social occasion for them to bring their partners.

Should the incidents/breaches continue or the venue decides not to continue to work with the Police, it would be at that point enforcement would be considered by way of a formal Review of their licence and this email would be produced as evidence together with the letter/email which will go to the agent and applicant giving full details of the visit and agreed actions. West Midlands Police are making no representations at this point in relation to Melanie Jordan becoming the DPS.

In the early hours of Sunday 26th September I was on full uniform foot patrol together with POLICE CONSTABLE 23125 WOOLDRIDGE, POLICE CONSTABLE 22726 MATTOO and POLICE CONSTABLE 24600 MCLAUGHLIN.

At this time we were engaged in licensing visits and patrols in BRIDGE STREET, WALSALL TOWN CENTRE.

At about 0000 hrs we attend LEXX BAR AND GRILL. At the front of the premises I spoke to a couple of door staff. I then spoke to a male who I believe to be the manager named Derek MINNOTT. I asked him some questions around how many people were inside, the capacity and what time he was closing. I informed him we would be carrying out a walk through of the premises which we then did. When I got to the rear of the premises/outside there was a strong smell of cannabis that had been smoked. I raised my concern with MINNOTT who did not appear happy of what I pointed out. I could not ascertain who had been smoking it but it was clearlyt being smoked on the premises. I am a serving Police Officer with 21 years service so can identify the smell. I could not see any fire exit to the rear of the premises so asked MINNOTT where the was one and there was only one fire exit nearer to the front of the premises.

I recorded my concerns in his occurrence book. I saw that when we were outside the door staff were searching people before entry. I was later informed that these searches were not being done when officers were not visibly present outside on the town centre CCTV.

There was also lots of cars outside that belonged to customers who I saw coming and going. They had also blocked the pavement with a Vauxhall the occupant of which was selling wristbands which I assumed were for entry. They had also blocked the pavement with railings and customers were queuing into the road to get in causing a danger to themselves and other road users.

I believe the facts stated in this witness statement and as amended in any tracked changes [and initialled] are true.

On Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> October 2020 I was on uniformed duties in Walsall Town Centre. I had been tasked with performing licencing checks on licenced premises within the vicinity, which included the use of drugs swipes in areas such as toilets to check for Class A drugs activity.

At around 1130 hours officers attended Lexx Jerkz Bar and Grill. Upon arrival at the location officers found it was open. There were only a small number of customers within the bar area. There were two staff members behind the bar, and a security staff member in the public area. Officers asked if the DPS was on premises. We were told no. None of the staff appeared to know who was in charge. The security officer wore a jacket which said security across the back and front which clearly identified him. However he was not wearing a SIA badge on his arm or anywhere else that was visible. The guard assisted officers in accessing the toilets and other areas of the premises.

Drug swipes were conducted in both toilets. Drug traces were located from within one of the toilets by other officers. Near to the toilets was a staircase leading to the first floor. As I was stood near this I noticed people coming up and down the stairs to the bar. The door was wedged open so there was no physical barrier in operation preventing access. I presumed this was another public area. I requested Staff escort me upstairs to what I discovered was some sort of recording studio. Here I could smell a strong aroma of what I recognise as Herbal Cannabis. Within the recording studios were desks. I swabbed these areas and there was no trace of drugs having been used on the table.

Statement of Simon Bytheway

Whilst stood on the first floor of the premises, I saw an insecure door leading to a staircase. I requested staff show me what was up here. Again there was no lock or sign to prevent public from entering. As I went upstairs I could see a double bed within the store room. There was no persons present, and no smell of drugs within.

Officers waited in the rear garden area for the landlord Derek to return. Upon arrival Derek informed me that the Security member was on duty at the time. I am aware that Derek had been hostile towards officers on the telephone. He believed a search warrant was being conducted. When he discovered this was not the case he calmed down and was plesant.

Derek was made fully aware of the reasons for why officers attended. He was aware that positive drugs swipes had been conducted within the establishments toilets, and also that there was a strong smell of cannabis within the recording area.

When officers attended the location it was relatively quiet with only a small number of customers. However, when officers returned past the location several hours later, there were approximately 25 vehicles parked on the pavement outside the location. Lexx was the only venue open at this time, and officers saw people coming and going from the location.

My visit was captured on my bodycam. I now produce this in evidence as follows:

### Good morning all

My apologies for taking so long to come back to you but as Nick is now aware, I was involved in a car accident which resulted in a few weeks off work. I'm back on the mend now so I would like to address the current Action Plan and our last discussions which took place last month on 25<sup>th</sup> November, nearly a month ago now.

Going back to our meeting on the 28<sup>th</sup> September 21, a number of concerns were highlighted which resulted in your venue being placed on an Action Plan, these concerns were communicated via a letter dated the 14<sup>th</sup> October. Due to illness and concerns you had, we were unable to meet again until 25<sup>th</sup> November. Since that date, I have only been on duty a few days before going off work myself until this week and presently I am working from home. Our meeting on the 25<sup>th</sup> November, although professional and worthwhile, I believe it was also about moving forward in such a way that we felt comfortable to work together in achieving the same aims. Unfortunately during our meeting we discussed your concerns that I had been raciest due to ethnicity, which as you can imagine when I first heard, came as a shock to me as you have no idea of my personal background, however, I hopefully ensured that any matters were aired and addressed so that we could move forward. I would like to point out that in my entire working life I have never been accused of causing such concerns, so as you can imagine I was horrified to hear this and trust that we can further develop a good working relationship. It would also be worth noting that we are only having discussions regarding an Action Plan due to the fact that you have not been operating within the Licensing Act 2003 and subsequently other legalisation..

As the Action Plan was for a three month time span and a copy of the Action Plan was never agreed or communicated to you due to the issues above I therefore feel it only appropriate and sensible to deem the Action Plan inactive. Derek has mentioned you are not currently advertising events, there is a Restriction Notice on the venue limiting capacity and with footfall being reduced on the town due to the NHS COVID passes it would be totally bureaucratic to continue.

From our meetings a number of concerns were raised so I would like to use this opportunity to run through a few of these from a police perspective:

### Noise complaints:

From our last meeting the last complaint received was on the 17<sup>th</sup> October. On speaking with Sarah prior to her breaking up for the Christmas holiday they have had only one new complaint but this did not include any noise monitoring evidence so has been filed.

### Rear fire exist:

This has been addressed by yourselves with the Fire Service becoming the lead agency.

### Smoking within the building:

This has been highlighted to you with Environmental health becoming the lead agency.

### Trading beyond the licensable hour:

From the meeting on 25<sup>th</sup> November there has been no new evidence of additional trading

### Crime and Disorder:

On the 18<sup>th</sup> December we did have an incident which resulted in a crime being created for public order involving people within your queue. It was noted by the officers attending that your security staff were wearing all black with no one appearing to have any authority or control over the queue. During the public

order incident the only reason police know who they were, was because they had spoken to them earlier in the evening. Can I please ask for some guidance to your door staff on management of your queue and for you to consider hi vis vests.

To finish I must add, to see Derek at our multi-agency meeting lead by Mr Dolby on the current issues in Bridge Street and Ablewell Street was met with positivity and with you joining Pub Watch evidences commitment to work with the police and I would personally like to thank you for that. I would also like to set up one last meeting in the New Year, unless anything occurs in the meantime, to sign off this series of meetings and give you the opportunity to address any new concerns.

I wish you all a good Christmas and although we may see a bumpy start to the new year, fingers crossed for a better 2022.

Sarah,

I met with Mr Derrick Minott (Manager) and Tashan Nesbeth (Head doorman, PGS Security) of the Lexx Bar & Grill, 75 Bridge St, Walsall this evening, in relation to reports of violence, obstruction of police and strong smells of cannabis in their premises over the past few weeks. I have agreed to give him an overview of the incidents I am currently aware of, below:

18/12/2021 Friday 02:40 Between material times offender have been arguing and pushing and shoving at the door of Lexx Bar and Grill.

01/01/2022 Friday 04:18 THREE MALES HAVE BEEN INVOLVED IN A FIGHT OUTSIDE LEXX JERKZ BAR AND GRILL. Offender admitted to being drunk in this bar earlier, when he was involved in a confrontation.

19/02/2022 Friday 04:13 Reports of Disorder, Bridge St, outside Jamaican Restaurant. 20 people in involved. Vehicle also made off from officers, lights off.

19/02/2022 Friday u/k Strong cannabis smell emanating from the premises on a number of occasions. Some of the staff have also been quite obstructive towards Police Officers by such actions as refusing to give numbers of occupants, blocking them gaining access to the premises and having an unprofessional attitude.

(20/02/2022 Saturday 02:00 Doorman in uniform and showing SIA ID badge found in possession of cannabis in Bridge St. Originally believed to be working at Lexx Bar, but Manager and Head Doorman have now denied this – investigation required to confirm his workplace.)

Both deny that this final incident is connected to Lexx Bar in any way, but I have recorded it here as this was our belief up until this meeting – we will investigate this further to confirm.

I have explained to both men the scale of the violence issue we have in Bridge Street during their opening hours on a Fri-Sat and Sat-Sun, and that there is a real focus by both West Midlands Police and Walsall Council to tackle this. Police officers reports of obstructive door staff and strong smells of cannabis were highlighted as having been made previously, so show a pattern of activity. These are evidence of poor management, and thus we were going to ask them to consider additional management actions to assist them in meeting the licensing objectives. Attached are some additional conditions I am asking them to consider, with a request to reply by **Tuesday 1**st **March.** I have made it clear that if breaches continue we will be seeking reduced opening hours.

I have also stated that I will be instructing police officers to regularly visit Lex Bar this weekend to ensure all the current conditions are being strictly adhered to, that there is no smell of cannabis and the staff are supportive and aware of their legal obligations.

I have also told both men that there are a number of other premises we also have concerns about and that we will be taking the same approach with them.

This statement is in relation to Lexx Jerkz Bar & Grill, 75 Bridge street, Walsall when it is open as a bar of a night. The information in this statement is derived from my own personal experiences when I have been on duty working the night time economy and also from information I have obtained from Police systems and having spoken to other Police Officers around the night time economy in Walsall.

When working the night time economy my role along with other officers on duty is to monitor the licenced premises in the town centre and to keep the public safe. To do this officers visit the licenced alcohol establishments at various times during the evening and early hours of the morning to ascertain the number of door staff on duty, whether their CCTV is working and customer numbers at each venue. We will also periodically undertake walkthroughs of the premises to assess the temperament of people in the premises and the ensure there are no obvious illegal activities or licencing issues at a particular premise.

I have worked the night time economy on a number of occasions since the beginning of November 2021 and at some point, during my tour of duty I will endeavour to visit all the licenced premises that are open in Walsall town identified as part of our patrol area. When I have done this at Lexx on several occasions I would have described the door staff's behaviour towards me as very guarded. They will all stand by the door which they keep closed and if I ask any licencing questions one of them very guarded and furtively hardly open the door to the club and literally squeeze themselves through the smallest of gaps they have created as though trying to stop anyone being able to see inside as they enter. After a short time one of the other staff will then come out of the door to talk to me. When the door is opened even to that small extent I have had a strong smell of cannabis hit me. This is not a smell of one person's quantity but what I would describe as a significant smell from a large amount of cannabis.

Two particular occasions that I recall the dates of having this smell from the premises were in the early hours of the 7/11/21 when I had to deal with a drug gang related incident that appeared to originate inside Lexx. This incident involve two drug dealers having a dispute that spread out of Lexx into the street which I managed to calm down before it escalated to violence. There was at least one other incident I have witnessed but I cannot recall if they were on the 13/11/21, 12/12/21 or the 24/12/21. The other occasion I do recall was the early hours of the 12/2/22. I recall this as I was aware of a pattern of the smell coming from the premises from previous visits so when I attended on this occasion I was looking to see if I could smell cannabis again which I did.

As a result of having it confirmed from my own personal observations that there was a persistent smell of Cannabis emanating from Lexx and having other officers making such comments to me describing the staff as obstructive and confirming that they could smell cannabis coming from the premises when they have done checks I undertook research on Police systems. As a result of this research I became aware of positive Class A drugs swabs being found in the toilets and a strong smell of cannabis during a walkthrough. On several other occasions there is information relating to cannabis smell being observed by other people whilst undertaking walkthroughs or visiting the premises. I am also aware from peoples observations that staff are allowing females who are underage to drink in the premises.

From Police systems in 2015 Melanie JORDAN (Director of Lexx) and her partner Derrick MINOTT (Manager of Lexx) were spoken to by Officers at their home address with regards to an intercepted parcel from Jamaica containing 100g of Cocaine that was posted to their home. They denied any knowledge of this parcel at that time and there was no further Police Action.

From the above information I believe that the owners and staff of the premises would be aware of Cannabis usage and underage drinking on their premises. From the staff's furtive behaviour I also believe that drug usage is allowed or even encouraged on the premises by those responsible. I have therefore concluded that the premises is persistently being used for drugs usage, those responsible for the premises are aware of this and it goes without doubt that this is unreasonable behaviour.

The result of drugs usage in the town of a night time has led to a significant community impact to those living, working in and visiting the area. This has also resulted in Policing having to be increased of a night to keep people safe at significant cost to the West Midlands Police Force. From my experiences and observations on the town Lexx is a magnet for many of the people who have caused a significant portion of these issues.

Good afternoon Mr Minott,

As promised I have reviewed the Decision Notice for the Premises License Review of the Bond Street Tavern in 2018. There is clearly evidence repeated failings and a lack of local police confidence in the management structure of the premises. It is particularly relevant to note that this includes similar concerns to those we have raised with yourself recently for Lexx Bar & Grill — the use of cannabis within the premises and obstructive door staff. Incidents of violence also feature at both premises.

These issues clearly undermine the licensing objectives and continue to raise concerns in relation to any closer involvement in the premises by yourself, such as you suggest. It is your choice as to when to apply for any Personal License, but I cannot give any reassurance that we would not object again.

Despite this fact we would still ask you to consider additional action you could take in the management of Lexx Bar, to help protect both your customers and the wider public in the town centre. I will ask Jenny Mellor, our licensing officer, to discuss this with you over the coming days.

I understand your concerns, but as we discussed at the meeting, do not accept the context of all that has been listed. But we all have to move on and work together, for the benefit of the Town Centre Night Time Economy.

I have looked through your proposed Conditions.

Can you just explain to me: By what means do you want the Conditions of my Licence changed so that they now adopt these new requirements?

The situation of my business is not ideal, mainly for the reason that the Police will not accept me as DPS of my own premises. This is because of something that happened several years ago when I had another business. However the incident complained about on that occasion happened nearly five years ago. Had my Personal Licence been revoked by the Licensing Authority (which it wasn't) I would have been able to reapply for a Personal Licence after five years anyway. With the time that has passed in between then and now, coupled with the fact that I am now the manager of Lexx and have been since 2019, I think the time has now come for me to assume the duties as DPS so that you and I can work together, going forwards, through PubWatch and any other form of partnership-working.

If we can agree that I can be instated as the DPS (as well as Manager) of Lexx, then I am very open to considering the new list of conditions ONCE you have explained to me how they can be placed on my Premises Licence.

Good afternoon Melanie

West Midlands Police are continuing to smell cannabis at your premise together with concerns you are operating over capacity.

On Saturday evening in the early hours of Sunday morning one of our Sgts were engaging with your door staff. When asked on their capacity numbers they initially stated they had 122 customers inside, but when challenged a lady called Melanie which could have been yourself, stated she only had 90 persons inside. Whilst the Sgt was at your premise Melanie stopped persons entering stating that the venue was now at capacity and was a "one in one out" from this time. Today the Local Authority CCTV was viewed from the point where the police left the venue to ensure that the "one in one out" direction was being followed which was the case until 02:50 hours. Nine people were then allowed entry to the premises by door staff in the following 5 minutes with no customers leaving through the same route. The Sqt has also commented that the smell of cannabis could be smelt emanating from your club.

Can you please confirm if this was yourself at the door and why the venue was allowed to go over capacity with a continued smell of cannabis

#### Spate of violence in Walsall leads to increase in police patrols

Violence has increased in the centre of Walsall in recent weekends, with Bridge Street and Leicester Street seeing an increase in incidents according to West Midlands Police.

Flashpoints have included a man needing hospital treatment after <u>being punched to the ground</u> <u>during a fight</u> with three other men on Leicester Street last Saturday.

The week before, father-of-two Daniel Wheeler <u>fractured his skull and suffered a bleed on the brain</u> when he was hit by a car which mounted the pavement on Bridge Street. The same vehicle was also seen driving the <u>wrong way down one-way streets and weaving across roads</u>.

And in another incident weapons were used during a brawl in the town.

West Midlands Police is now increasing the number of patrols in the town in a bid to clamp down on the violence.

The force said it has a good working relationship with the local hospitality industry and Walsall Council's licensing team and will work with venues to prevent any licensing breaches.

Inspector Liz Pearson, who is responsible for policing in Walsall, said: "We've seen an increase in people returning to the town centre, which is great.

<sup>&</sup>quot;I can completely understand that people are excited to get out and meet people following the lifting of the restrictions we've all been under.

"We know it often starts as aggressive behaviour fuelled by excessive drinking but it has had some devastating consequences.

"We want people to enjoy a safe evening so we're stepping up our policing presence, and we continue to work with security staff in licensed premises, and our wider partners.

"Please come and enjoy our vibrant town centre - but be kind - we must look after each other and enjoy a great atmosphere."





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### Police 'forced to fight for lives' dealing with drunken violence in Walsall

Police officers have been forced to fight for their lives while dealing with drunken violence in Walsall, the town's top cop has said.

Chief Superintendent Phil Dolby revealed the horrors his teams face as he described the night-time economy as a "blight on the town".

At a recent scrutiny overview committee meeting, Walsall Council leader Mike Bird said he wished the town closed at 6pm because of the crime levels.

Ch Spt Dolby, who was <u>made commander in Walsall 12 months after nearly dying</u> of coronavirus, told the meeting: "The night-time economy in the town is a blight upon the town. My officers and I have done it until five in the morning. They are physically fighting for their lives.

"It's not something that is going to bring anything to the town other than the wrong people."

"The nature of young people going out has changed over the last two years. They come late, they don't come until about midnight.

"What happens at 4am when everyone is chucking out is really difficult. There used to be a model where when we left at midnight, other cops would come in.

"That model isn't there any more so at the moment I'm spending a lot of public money on overtime to keep officers there until five in the morning.

"Of course, the hospitality industry is having a terrible time and I'm not trying to damage people's business but we can't afford to keep using public money to do that."

Police have had to deal with a number of incidents in and around the town centre during the past few months.

These include two men being stabbed in the early hours of a Saturday in January during an attack which took place in Leicester Street.

Meanwhile at around 4am 4am on Saturday, September 11 last year, 31-year-old Dan Wheeler suffered a fractured skull and bleed on the brain when a car mounted a pavement in Bridge Street and knocked him down.

And a week after that incident, a man was left needing hospital treatment after suffering a nasty cut to his head <u>during a fight which involved three other men</u>. He was punched and banged his head on the floor in Leicester Street

Councillor Bird said the council could help the police in its role licensing premises in the borough.

The Conservative authority leader said: "I used to say years ago, Walsall closed at 6pm. I wish it did now because the crime we get from alcohol fuelled individuals.
