# Barr Beacon Car Wash, Beacon Road / Moreton Avenue

# 1.0 **PURPOSE OF REPORT / REASON FOR URGENCY**

To seek authority to apply to the civil court for an injunction under section 187B of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

Urgent action is required to secure compliance with the enforcement notice, and resolve the continuing adverse impact of the site on the area.

### 2.0 **RECOMMENDATIONS**

Authorise the Assistant Director of Legal and Constitutional Services to seek an injunction under section 187B of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, to prevent use of the site as a car wash, as set out in the enforcement notice dated 22 March 2007.

## 12 BACKGROUND AND REPORT DETAIL

- 12.1 An enforcement notice was issued on 22 March 2007 requiring the cessation of the use of the site as a car wash. There was an appeal in 2007, and it was dismissed. The use should have ceased early in 2008.
- 12.2 Prosecution action has been taken against the operators, but the individual in question is proving elusive, and the issue is unresolved.
- 12.3 It is open to the Council, as an alternative to prosecution for breach of the enforcement notice, to apply for an injunction, requiring all parties with an interest in the site, or otherwise involved, to cease the unauthorised use as a car wash.
- 12.4 Failure to comply with an injunction, if the courts grant one, is sometimes a more serious matter than non-compliance with an enforcement notice, and is likely to increase the prospects for success in controlling this activity on the site.
- 12.5 It is recommended that an application for an injunction be made to the court, and that officers be authorised to take that action.
