Resource and legal considerations

Finance

The ICES pooled budget was £1.317m in 2008/2009, which was funded by £0.536m from NHS Walsall and £0.781m by Walsall Council.

At the end of the financial year the pooled budget is predicted to be £0.094m under spent. The overspend is funded by the partners in line with their percentage contributions to the pool in line with the partnership agreement. As such, Walsall's Council's contribution was approximately £0.056m.

Appendix 1 shows the ICES pooled budget memorandum account, which has been signed off by the Chief Finance Officer.

The main reason for the overspend was increased demand for equipment.

It should be noted that the position is subject to audit and final reporting to the Disability Services Partnership Executive Group (PEG) on 31 July 2009
