Report to Willenhall and Short Heath Area Panel 4 March 2014 Participatory Budget Funding Report

1. Context

- 1.1 At its meeting held on 3 September, 2013 Willenhall Area Panel passed a resolution to set aside £10,000 of its funding for a 'Willenhall and Short Heath Area Partnership Specific' participatory budgeting project. The process was developed to ensure that groups would be able to bid for funding to deliver small projects in their communities that meet the priorities of the Area Plan.
- **1.2** All project applications received by the Area Partnership team, have been assessed against a set of criteria, before being put forward to the Area Panel for consideration. Only valid applications that fulfil the criteria will be put to the panel for decision.
- 1.3 At the Special Area Panel meeting held on 4 March 2014, the applicants presented their projects to provide evidence that they meet the priorities of the Area Plan and the Walsall Plan. Following this, the summarised projects were made available on line for people to view.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1 That the Area Panel considers the applications as detailed in appendix 1 to this report and make a decision as to whether an award should be granted;
- **2.2** That any remaining funds be returned to the Willenhall and Short Heath Area Partnership general fund.

3. Project Applications for Approval

- **3.1** Attached at Appendix 1 are the summarised project applications deemed valid against Area Partnership funding criteria and put forward to the Area Panel for consideration.
- 3.2 The total proposed projects in Appendix 1 for the panels' consideration is £7024.00
- 3.3 The remaining budget allocation of £2976.00 will be allocated back to the Willenhall and Short Heath general allocation, subject to approval by the Panel.
