Determination of statutory proposal to significantly enlarge Caldmore Primary School

1. Summary

This report provides information to enable Cabinet to decide whether it wishes to approve the statutory proposals to significantly enlarge Caldmore Primary School by increasing the admission number from 30 to 60 from 1 September 2012 and a scheme from the Education Asset Management Plan for approval.

2. Recommendations

That Cabinet approve the statutory proposal to enlarge Caldmore Primary School by increasing the admission number from 30 to 60 from 1 September 2012.

3. Background information

- 3.1 Caldmore Primary School is a community school with 30 places in each year group and places for a total of 210 pupils excluding the nursery class.
- 3.2 Additional primary school places are needed in order to meet an increasing demand for primary school places in the local area as a result of recent and planned residential developments and also because of an increase in the number of births. In order to meet this increased demand for places, it is proposed to significantly enlarge Caldmore Primary School and increase the intake from 30 to 60 with effect from 1 September 2012.
- 3.3 There are 52 part-time places in the nursery class; it is not proposed to change this provision as it is already in line with the usual number of nursery places for a primary school with two forms of entry.

4. Resource considerations

4.1 **Financial**:

- 4.1.1 If the proposals are approved by Cabinet, there would be a requirement for capital investment at the schools in order to provide additional teaching accommodation. It is proposed to carry out this work at an overall cost of £2.8 million using funds from Walsall's current Education capital allocations.
- 4.1.2 This scheme is to be managed by Walsall Council Property Services who will ensure compliance with all Walsall Council Finance and Contract Rules.

4.2 Legal:

- 4.2.1 The proposal to significantly enlarge Caldmore Primary School is subject to statutory procedures.
- 4.2.2 On 14 September 2011, Cabinet considered responses received during the consultation period and approved the publication of statutory proposals. These proposals were published on 6 October 2011 and a representation period of four weeks followed. It is now for Cabinet to consider the responses received during this period and 'determine' the statutory proposals. A copy of the full proposals is attached as Appendix 1.
- 4.2.3 Subject to completion of the statutory processes detailed above, the admission number for the school would be increased to 60 from 1 September 2012.
- 4.2.4 The statutory guidance to be considered by decision-makers when considering expanding a mainstream maintained school has been made available to Cabinet. Such expansions are classed as 'prescribed alterations'. It is not considered that the presumption for the expansion of popular and successful schools should apply. The decision-maker must indicate the main factors/criteria for the decision.
- 4.2.5 Legislation sets out that the following bodies may appeal against a Local Authority decision on school expansion proposals:
 - the local Church of England diocese;
 - the bishop of the local Roman Catholic diocese;
 - where the school provides education for pupils aged 14 and over- the Learning and Skills Council (*now abolished*);
 - the governing body of the community school that is proposed for expansion; and
 - the governors and trustees of the foundation or voluntary school that is proposed for expansion.
- 4.2.6 Any appeals must be submitted to the local authority within 4 weeks of the notification of the local authority's decision.

4.2.7 The capital scheme will be managed through Walsall Council Property Services and they will ensure that all statutory obligations are met.

4.3 **Staffing**:

4.3.1 There are no direct implications as a result of this report. If the school is enlarged as proposed, additional teachers and other staff would be required on a phased basis and these would be funded through the school's revenue budget.

5. Citizen impact

- 5.1 Local residents would have improved access to a place at a local primary school for their child.
- 5.2 The scheme will contribute to an improved barning environment for Walsall pupils, their families and the wider community.

6. Community safety

Security issues will be considered as part of the development of the capital scheme.

7. Environmental impact

- 7.1 Should the proposal be implemented, the associated scheme would incorporate the use of sustainable resources wherever possible and the design would incorporate developments to reduce the impact on the environment.
- 7.2 The proposed provision of additional primary school places in this area would contribute to reducing car journeys to school in future years.
- 7.3 The scheme will incorporate the use of sustainable resources wherever possible and the design would incorporate developments to reduce the impact on the environment.

8. Performance and risk management issues

8.1 **Risk**:

- 8.1.1 If the proposed additional primary school places are not provided, there is a risk that parents will not be able to secure a place for their child at a local primary school.
- 8.1.2 Construction programmes are at risk of delays that might affect the timescales and cost of projects that may require adjustments to the programme. These risks will be managed as far as is practicable on an ongoing basis.

8.2 **Performance management**:

- 8.2.1 The adequacy of the supply of school places is assessed by the DfE through an annual return.
- 8.2.2 There are specific criteria established by the DfE for the project management of schemes funded by the Capital Programme within the designated timeframe.

9. Equality implications

- 9.1 If the proposal is implemented, the accessibility of the school buildings would be improved through the provision of replacement accommodation to current standards.
- 9.2 The proposed scheme would result in an improved learning environment for pupils and families in Walsall schools.

10.Consultation

- 10.1 Consultation on the proposal to significantly enlarge Caldmore Primary School by increasing the admission number from 30 to 60 from 1 September 2012 commenced on 20 June and ended on 31 July 2011. Cabinet considered a report on the outcome of this consultation on 14 September 2011 and approved publication of the statutory proposal.
- 10.2 The statutory proposal was published on 6 October 2011 and a four week representation period, during which representations (e.g. objections or comments) can be made, then followed. No responses were received during this period.
- 10.3 In view of the need for the proposed places, Cabinet is recommended to approve the statutory proposal to significantly enlarge Caldmore Primary School by increasing the admission number from 30 to 60 from 1 September 2012.

Alteration description

4. A description of the proposed alteration and in the case of special school proposals, a description of the current special needs provision.

In order to meet the demand for additional primary school places in the local area, Walsall Metropolitan Borough Council intends to enlarge Caldmore Primary School from 1 form of entry to 2 forms of entry from 1 September 2012. The current admission number for the school is 30 and the proposed admission number is 60. The current capacity of the school is 210 and the proposed capacity is 420.

School capacity

The current Net Capacity of the School is 210. The proposed capacity after the alteration (enlargement) is 420.

 b) details of the current number of pupils admitted to the school in each relevant age group, and where this number is to change, the proposed number of pupils to be admitted in each relevant age group in the first school year in which the proposals will have been implemented;

The current number of pupils admitted to the school in each relevant age group is 30. In the first school year in which the proposal is implemented, the number of pupils to be admitted to the reception year group is 60; the admission number for other year groups will be 30.

c) where it is intended that proposals should be implemented in stages, the number of pupils to be admitted to the school in the first school year in which each stage will have been implemented;

From September 2012 onwards the number of pupils to be admitted to the reception year group will be 60. The increased intake would move up through the school until it applied to all year groups.

The school currently only has one vacancy in Y5.

The number of pupils on roll at Caldmore Primary School is 208. In addition, there are 52 part-time pupils attending the nursery class. (Data from May 2011 School Census).

Objectives

10. The objectives of the proposals.

The objectives of the proposal are to enlarge Caldmore Primary School to 2 forms of entry by increasing the number of pupils to be admitted to the reception year group in September 2012 and subsequent years from 30 to 60.

The enlargement is necessary in order to meet the demand for additional places in the local area as a result of an increase in the birth rate and residential developments.

The consultation document together with a letter of explanation was made available to the Consultees detailed in Appendix A. Copies were also made available at Caldmore Primary School, the local community centre, local libraries and on-line. A large print version was also available on request. The letters and consultation documents detailed the dates, times and locations of meetings for the School Council, staff, governors and parents. Consultation documents were also available at the consultation meetings. Detailed notes were made at all of the meetings. All consultation responses have been retained.

Project costs

The estimated total capital cost of the proposal to significantly enlarge Caldmore Primary School is in the region of £2.8 million; these works would be undertaken as part of a scheme to address suitability and sufficiency issues. This cost would be met by the local authority.

13. A copy of confirmation from the Secretary of State, local education authority and the Learning and Skills Council for England (as the case may be) that funds will be made available (including costs to cover any necessary site purchase).

At the meeting on 14 September 2011, Cabinet received a report on the outcome of consultation on a proposal to significantly enlarge Caldmore Primary School from 1 September 2012.

Members were advised that if the proposal went ahead, there would be a requirement for significant capital investment at the school in order to provide additional teaching accommodation and to undertake other planned improvements. The cost of the works which would be required should the proposed enlargement be agreed would be met by funding from formulaic allocations (Basic Need) from the Department for Education (DfE) and from the funding made available to Walsall through the Primary Capital Programme.

Having considered all of the information contained in the report, Cabinet decided to approve the publication of a statutory proposal to significantly enlarge Caldmore

Primary School from 1 September 2012.

Additional primary school places are needed in order to meet an increasing demand for primary school places in the local area, as a result of an increase in the birth rate and recent and planned residential developments. There has been an increase in the demand for places in the area adjacent to the school and also in adjoining areas near the centre of the town. It is therefore proposed to provide additional places at Caldmore Primary School and increase the number of reception places to 60 from 1 September 2012. This will ensure that the vast majority of children who live in the local neighbourhood are able to secure a place at a local school. The school is now oversubscribed and this proposal will enable more parents to secure a place at their preferred school.
