Brief Description of the project

To purchase 8000 one-way ('clutch head') screws for distribution to garden shed owners, for use of securing shed door hinges by preventing removal. Eight screws will be distributed for each shed, allowing 1000 sheds in the area to be secured.

A spate of shed burglaries has been identified where offenders gain entry by removing door hinges.

How much does the project cost?

£250 + VAT for the purchase of the clutch head screws.

Quote provided by Locks and Fittings Ltd., Rolling Mill Street, Walsall.

How does the proposal link to LNP local plans?

Will reduce crime in the LNP area and reassure residents.

How does proposal link to Council Vision 2008?

Crime reduction

Assurance that the proposal is not contrary to Council policy

The proposal is not contrary to Council policy.

Impact of the proposal?

To reduce burglary from garden sheds. High profile police activity in the LNP area while screws are being delivered.

Value for money?

Are the identified benefits worth the costs to be incurred.

I feel that £250 is an inexpensive way of securing 1000 garden sheds. The project also offers an opportunity to deliver general crime reduction and reassurance information.

Match funding:

Does this proposal attract any match funding (in cash or kind) from council partners or other organisations?

West Midlands Police will package the screws into sets of eight together with crime reduction information and distribute to homes in the area. Residents will be expected to arrange to have the screws fitted themselves.

If approved, this officer (usually a Service Manager) who will be responsible for ordering the work, spending the money in compliance with the Council's contract and financial procedure rules

Brief Description of the project

To purchase 50 neighbourhood watch street signs for use in the Palfrey and Pleck LNP area, to replace existing free signs that have deteriorated and supply signs to newly setup watches. The signs requested are printed in two colours (white and black) on strong yellow UV-stabilised PVC for high visibility. Printing to include the national Crimestoppers number (0800 555 111) and neighbourhood watch logo.

14 signs will be supplied to watch schemes in Redhouse Street, Arundel Street, Collins Street, Whitehall Road, Villiers Street and Dale Street to replace existing signs that have deteriorated. The rest will be used to support existing and new schemes in the Delves and Pleck areas. Newly set up schemes in Gower Street and Hough Road will benefit from several signs.

How much does the project cost?

£9.17 plus VAT per sign, total cost £458.50 plus VAT (£538.75 inc VAT).
