Harnessing Technology grant

1. Summary of report

The report sets out the proposed allocation of the Harnessing Technology grant to schools. These projects will provide improved ICT learning environments for Walsall pupils.

2. Recommendations

That Cabinet approves the allocation to schools as set out in **Appendix 1.**

3. Background information

- 3.1 The Harnessing Technology Grant was introduced by the DCSF in 2008 to replace all former ICT standards funds.
- 3.2 As per national guidance, 25% of the grant will be retained for regional initatives and aggregated procurement and in addition, Education Walsall have already agreed with Schools Forum that an amount of the grant (£237,000) will be retained for specific projects in relation to e-Safety, the Becta Self-Review Framework, community wireless technologies and upgrading the circuits in place to provide connectivity to schools.

4. Resource considerations

4.1 Financial:

- 4.1.1 As previously reported the authority has been advised of capital allocations for the three-year period from 2008/09. The capital grant available in 2008/09 is £0.934m and the council is required to provide match funding from Dedicated Schools Grant of £0.217m giving a total funding available for this project of £1.151m.
- 4.1.2 As part of the funding information, schools will be provided with information as supplied by the DCSF as to how this funding should be used. These priorities include:

- the extension of ICT access and ICT-based services
- the implementation of learning platforms to enable learners to store and access their work and related information and resources on a secure online space, enabling teachers to share resources and view individual progress more easily
- systems to achieve better use and integration of information to support learning, including assessment, attendance, behaviour and more regular reporting and updates to parents
- investment in a range of technologies to support classroom-based learning (for example, interactive whiteboards and related tools, and other technologies like data loggers).
 - the upgrade of connectivity bandwidths appropriate to particular circumstances and needs, ensuring learners have good access to internet-based services and resources to support their learning at any time while in school
- 4.1.3 The process for schools will be as per the current Devolved Formula Capital process to ensure that schools are using the funding as appropriate to meet the conditions.
- 4.1.4 The funding available for schools (after funding £0.525m for regional initiative as described in paragraph 3.2 above) is £0.626m. It is proposed that the funding will be allocated on the basis of £1000 per school plus £11.88 per full-time equivalent pupil. This uses the same formula as previously recommended by the DfES for other ICT grants. The allocations to each school are listed at **Appendix 1.**
