Local Area Agreement Quarter 3 Monitoring Report

Report:

This briefing note informs the Panel of progress against the performance of Local Area Agreement (LAA) targets for the period of Quarter 3 2009/10. On the basis of the information within this note the Panel may well consider whether to add this to its work programme.

Appendix 1 sets out performance of those indicators relevant to the Health Scrutiny Panel, with Appendix 2 listing the remaining indicators in the LAA. Within the table Red, Amber and Green ratings have been attributed to each indicator based on the latest position against 2009/10 targets, with additional comments providing background to these ratings.

The current position shows there are four Red (Adult Participation in Sport, Childhood Obesity, Teenage Conceptions and All Age All Cause Mortality Rate) rated Indicators of relevance to this Panel.

Explanations on the current position of the Red rated targets have been provided below.

The adult participation in sport indicator (NI 008) is currently rated as Red due to the results of the Active People 2 survey being below the 2009/10 agreed target. Despite this performance has shown improvement over the past year. As with all Local Area Agreement targets a Target Action Plan (TAP) has been created setting out existing and proposed activity aimed at achieving the 2010/11 target. Through this Target Action Plan an ongoing audit of provision has been established aiming to identify any particular gaps whilst also informing any future commissioning. This has seen a range of new activities being established including; adult free swimming, meet and greet team to support and retain new attendees, borough wide pedometer challenge to promote independent walking and a marketing campaign to ensure awareness of activities. It is believed that Walsall's Active People 3 survey will show significantly improved results as a consequence of these targeted activities.

Both NI 56 (Childhood Obesity) and NI 112 (Teenage Conceptions) continue to be rated Red due to them being out-turned annually on lagged data. In an

attempt to provide more current data work is being undertaken between Walsall Partnership, Children's Services and NHS Walsall to utilise quarterly proxy/process data from the World Class Commissioning monitoring process. Once this process has been finalised members will be informed of any decisions made. In relation to NI 56 preventative programmes are currently being undertaken for both children and families; examples of these are the 'Make it Count', SHAPE, and the WAY4ward programme. All of these programmes will continue into 2010/11.

Finally members are requested to note that the figures for NI 120 show that the boroughs 'All Age All Cause Mortality Rate' continues to remain high despite an improvement since last year's outturn.

Recommendations:

That:

- 1. Members note the current position on those indicators relevant to the panel.
- 2. Members consider attributing the achievement of failing targets to their work programme.

This is directly comparable to the NI 8 baseline result established in 2005/6 and whilst it has increased by 0.7 % points shows no statistically significant change at present. However, there are positive signs because aligned to Sport England's strategic focus; the 'one million target' is based on a sports participation indicator that includes a narrower range of activities than NI 8. NI 8 includes moderate activity for over 65s. Walsall's 'One million indicator' result from Active People Survey 3 has increased statistically significantly to 20.1% from 13.4%. As the 20.1% result will be equal to or lower than an areas NI8 measure it suggests that next year's NI 8 result should start to show improvement because the NI 8 score will be refreshed with results from AP3 and AP4 results so that the poorer performing year's data from AP2 survey will be excluded. So as our improvement strategies progress their success will be reflected in an improved out-turn. Whilst this indicator continues to rag RED; we are optimistic for improved outcomes. The next interim update will be available during the summer based on April 09-April 10 results.
