# Funding Report 15 July 2015

#### 1. Context

A new boxing club would like to take up residence in Darlaston Town Hall. The club would offer community boxing sessions/training, for females and males from Darlaston and its surrounding areas. The funding application is to purchase the necessary equipment to help the new club get started, including a ring and boxing gloves, bags, head guards etc. The former boxing club, Amphion, left back in December 2014 due to no longer having a club coach. Sport and Leisure are working with the National Governing Body of boxing to support a boxing coach who is keen to establish a new club. There is demand in Darlaston for boxing as a sport, and the space is currently empty so we would like to see it utilised. It will Darlaston as an area has low participation in sport and physical activity, and in the Walsall lifestyle
survey 9% of Darlaston residents said they would be interested in Boxing. It will work with 9 year olds plus and deliver 3 days a week.
