# WILLENHALL AND SHORT HEATH AREA PANEL Area Manager's Report Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> June 2016

### 1. Purpose of the Report

- 1.1 This report seeks to inform Elected Members for the Willenhall and Short Heath Area Partnership of some of the work carried out within the local area.
- 1.2 Willenhall and Short Heath Area Partnership has a number of key priorities which have been identified through work with partner agencies, Walsall Intelligence Network and the local community.
- 1.3 The strategic priorities are:
  - Safer Walsall: Creating safe, sustainable and inclusive communities
  - Children and Young People: Improving safeguarding, learning and life chances for children and young people
  - Business and Jobs: Supporting businesses to thrive and supporting local people in to work
  - Health and Well-Being: Improving health, including well-being and independence for older people
- 1.4 Partners involved includes: Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) Unit, Youth Support Services, West Midlands Police, residents, Ward Councillors, Walsall Housing Group (WHG), West Midlands Probation Service, Walsall Intelligence Network, Environmental Health, Reassurance Team, Anti-Social Behaviour Team, Willenhall and Short Heath Area Partnership, Public Health, Caldmoreaccord Housing Association, Walsall Voluntary Action, West Midlands Fire Service, Social Care and Inclusion, Area Family Support Team, Trading Standards, Community Development, Substance Matters, Willenhall CHART, Willenhall E-Act, Clean and Green, Sports and Leisure, Jobcentre Plus, Steps to Work, Darlaston JET, Welfare Rights, Walsall College, Holy Trinity Online Centre, Libraries

## 2. Safer Walsall: Creating safe, sustainable and inclusive communities

- 2.1 Crime and anti-social behaviour continues to be discussed at the Confidential Tasking Meetings in Willenhall chaired by the Area Manager. Various partner agencies are involved in the discussions and actions undertaken to support those affected by the issues.
- 2.2 Through the work of the police team, supported by local intelligence, they have been able to tackle crime in various locations.

If you see anyone or anything suspicious in your local community please call officers on 101. Always dial 999 if a crime is in progress.

Likewise if you have information on people or properties linked to the handling of stolen property please call officers or contact the independent charity Crimestoppers in confidence on 0800 555 111.

### 2.3 Policing – Willenhall North & Short Heath

The Neighbourhood Team are working pro-actively with shop owners around New Invention Square to try to implement additional solutions to anti-social behaviour.

Recorded Crimes for April and May 16 compared to April and May 15 and there has been a 16.3% increase in Total Recorded Crime for Short Heath and Willenhall North.

### 2.4 Policing - Willenhall South

A statistical analysis of Total Recorded Crime for this beat year to date suggest crime has increased by 6.7% compared with last year (statistic considered TRC based on 16/6/14 - 15/6/15 1907 offences, 16/6/15 - 15/6/16 2045 offences).

The team's establishment remains 1 Sergeant, 3 Constables and 3 PCSO's, and are still based at Willenhall Police Station.

This has been a busy period, resulting in a great deal of media interest in relation to the burglary spike within the Town Centre targeting commercial businesses overnight.

Sergeant Rowlands is able to confirm during the period from 28 April to 16 May 2016, there have been twenty seven offences reported to the Police. The local Neighbourhood Policing Team, in conjunction with other police resources, have investigated this spike in crime.

As a result of the investigation, many hours of CCTV footage from both Walsall Council and private businesses have been seized and viewed, together with the collection of valuable forensic evidence has been recovered from scenes of the offences.

The Neighbourhood Team are pleased to report and as a direct result of this primary evidence gathering officers from the team identified the offenders.

Sgt Rowlands can confirm a 22 year old local male was arrested on the 16 May 2016, and has been charged with number of offences which include burglary, shop theft and possession of Class A drugs.

The 22 year old male appeared before Walsall Magistrates Court on 17 May 2016, and has been remanded into custody.

He has since pleaded guilty to 18 of these crimes and has received a 3 year 8 months custodial sentence.

In addition his accomplice was arrested on 19 May 2016 and was subsequently charged with 6 offences and subsequently remanded in custody to await his trial.

In addition to this positive news, there have been four further arrests for other commercial burglaries in the vicinity of Willenhall Town Centre.

During this period the Neighbourhood Team have been heavily involved in Operation Elm, the investigation of suspected sexual grooming of youths within Willenhall Town Centre, which was discovered following the detention of youths by the Neighbourhood Team, involved in accessing a disused premises in Willenhall.

This is an on-going police operation which has resulted in one male being arrested and bailed outside of the locality in order that further enquires can be undertaken.

Partnership working has been an essential tool against anti-social behaviour, with the Neighbourhood Team working closely with social landlord WHG in building a case and gaining a civil injunction against a couple living in Tyler Road who were responsible for terrorising neighbours.

Upon receipt of the injunction the Neighbourhood Team pugnaciously enforced the injunction resulting in two arrests of the offending householder.

As a direct result the offender has received a 2 year suspended sentence and a fine of £1500 at Walsall County Court.

In conjunction with Walsall Council, the team have secured 4 ABC contracts against youths involved in Anti-Social behaviour locally, holding them to account for their inappropriate behaviour.

With regard to Community Contact and Pop-up contact events, in addition to regular meetings attended by the team, the team held its annual Neighbourhood Watch Meeting at Willenhall Police Station, on Monday 25<sup>th</sup> April at 7pm, where local residents were given an opportunity to discuss local issues with both Police, Council officials and local councillors.

The aim was to enable residents who had concerns, to meet the police and begin to form a Neighbourhood Watch Group, supported by Kevin Pitt from the WMP Partnerships Team.

Residents and delegates from different communities attended, including those from Rosehill Gardens, Sikh Temple and local shop owners.

Various actions were agreed and followed up with different individuals and agencies.

Residents in Rosehill have formed a Neighbourhood Watch Group, supported by West Midlands Police.

The Neighbourhood Watch Group meets at the St Giles Community Room and work with the police, Area Partnership, whg and different services to make their neighbourhood a safer place to visit, live, work or play.

Various site visits have occurred with partners and a number of actions undertaken, including the clearing of needles (used/new), mattresses, cutting back of shrubs/trees, light emissions testing and general litter picks.

The police have provided additional patrols in the area, and whg's 'Out of Hours Team' regularly patrol the area.

In the spirit of supporting local events, the team were able to support the newly instigated Willenhall Transport Festival held in the Memorial Park on 12<sup>th</sup> June, with officers from the team despite being on rest day, attending the event, displaying two examples of current Police vehicles and reinforcing safety messaging with regard to vehicle security and vehicle crime prevention. Despite poor weather the event saw a great deal of community engagement.

The police team are also committed to attending both Barcroft and St Giles' schools summer fetes, as opportunities to break down barriers with the children but also to encourage crime prevention amongst the parents.

### 2.5 Willenhall Community Fire Station

### Response

Emergency incidents attended since January 2016 – 123 incidents

Emergency incidents attended April – May 2016 – 30 incidents, which included

- 3 accidental fires in the home.
  - o 2 related to cooking
  - 1 fire in a roof due to light being left on.
- 1 arson fire in home
  - Tenant starting a fire in a WHG property.
- 11 arson rubbish fires
  - 4 where in the area of Rough Wood (6 incidents this year)
  - Targeted approach with partners is being planned during summer
  - Other incidents involve areas of fly tipping.
- 6 road traffic collisions
- 3 special service calls

#### Prevention

The Firefighters have been actively involved in delivering safety messages in the local community.

These activities have included;

- Visits to local schools delivering our SPARKS education pack to Year 4 pupils
- Support local schools to enter into the Schools Safety quiz challenge. Resulting in 9 schools entering across station area. 3 successfully reached the Walsall area final on 14th June.
- Local nursery has visited the fire station, to support their project on 'people that help us'. Whilst on the fire station they have also visited the Fire Education Centre.
- Visited local pubs to promote summer drive campaign with delivery of posters, leaflets, beer mats and supporting landlords.
- Carried out Safe and Well visits in local area:
  - Safe and Well visit involves a 1 hour visit in the home. During the visit a number of safety areas discussed and the wellbeing of the occupier.

# 3. Children and Young People: Improving safeguarding, learning and life chances for children and young people

3.1 The Commissioned Youth Service for Willenhall & Short Heath has been organised. The successful organisation is Frank F Harrison.

The contract commenced from 1<sup>st</sup> June 2016 with outcomes linked to various criteria including:

- Number of young people engaged
- Assisting in reducing ASB
- Diverse range of positive activities for the young people
- Working across agencies to support local initiatives

Frank F Harrison will cover 3 wards: North Willenhall 4 Detached Sessions – per week South Willenhall 4 Detached Sessions – per week Short Heath 3 Detached Sessions – per week

The geographical 'hot spots' as identified by data, partners and communities will be the priority areas for deployment of the Frank F Harrison Youth Workers.

3.2 Willenhall Carnival occurred on 11<sup>th</sup> June 2016. The feedback from participants and visitors commented that it was the best one to date and they are hoping to improve even further next year.

### 3.3 Beacon Primary School

Area Partnership participated and supported the PTA & school to deliver a successful event at Beacon Primary School on Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> May 2016.

The event was linked to various community engagement activities, including those involving libraries, children centres and regeneration/job and employment opportunities.

# 4. Business and Jobs: Supporting businesses to thrive and supporting local people in to work

### 4.1. Walsall Business Week

Walsall Business Week ran from 6-10 June. There were 15 free seminars, briefings and workshops covering finance, digital technology, export, apprenticeships and training, lean manufacturing, business growth, business start up support, and growing your supply chain.

Run out of various venues in Walsall, the Business Week provided a range of opportunities to help support and grow your business.

4.2 Aspire 2 Engage Community Showcase Event is a project that has been developed with 2 Area Managers.

Over the last few months they have been working closely with the Community Programme team from Walsall Football Club on the project for all the community to get involved in, called Aspire2Engage.

4.3 Youth Employment Initiative (IMPACT)

Walsall Council is a delivery partner for the Youth Employment Initiative (IMPACT) programme being delivered across the Black country.

IMPACT will provide a Black Country co-ordinated response that will truly engage NEET's / unemployed young people aged 16-29 and move them towards positive outcomes. The programme is targeted at supporting young residents who are unemployed, not in education and training and help them get closer to a positive outcomes such as mainstream education and training, employment, apprenticeships and traineeships. Marginalised 15 year olds identified as at risk of becoming NEET are also eligible. Those marginalised communities who are unemployed, inactive, at risk of social inclusion will be specifically targeted to overcome barriers to participation.

The Black Country wide programme will be a multi agency approach that offers a personalised and joined up provision of local services to support young people. A varied menu of provision will be offered by local authorities and their approved delivery partners and it is expected that these will include statutory, voluntary and commercial providers, delivering alternative innovative options to mainstream delivery including short courses, specialist vocational provision, and creative activity to develop self confidence and personal skills.
