Resource and legal considerations

Services were requested to identify efficiency savings and investment for consideration in the setting of the 2010/11 corporate revenue budget and to review their base budgets in line with the corporate guidelines and estimated changes in inflation and pay awards.

1. Draft Revenue Budget 2010/11 – Social Care & Inclusion Portfolio

1.1 Cabinet on 18 November 2009 presented their draft revenue budget proposals for 2010/11 for consultation. These proposals, including savings and investment proposals for the services within the remit of this panel, were reported to the panel meeting on 30 November 2009.

2. Scrutiny Recommendations to Cabinet

2.1 At its budget scrutiny meeting on 30 November 2009, this panel received the detailed breakdown of investment bids and savings options submitted to Cabinet to enable the panel's recommendations to be made for Cabinet to consider as part of the budget process. The panel discussed the options in principle, and made the following recommendations to Cabinet:-.

That the Social Care and Inclusion Scrutiny and Performance Panel:

- 1. note the budget presentation received;
- 2. request that the Council continues to prioritise social care for vulnerable adults within its budgetary process;
- 3. request hypothetical case studies to show the potential practical impact of proposals on individuals be provided to Panel Members prior to the next meeting on 18 January 2010;
- 4. request that guidance explaining the impact on learning disability of the pooled budget with NHS Walsall be provided to Panel Members prior to the

next meeting on 18 January 2010.

All recommendations have been reported and noted by Cabinet.

In relation to recommendation 3 detailed analysis of the effects of the entitlements review will be concluded by the end of January and will be reported to the scrutiny panel in February.

In relation to recommendation 4 regarding the impact on Learning Disability of the Pooled Budget the panel is requested to note that the pooled budget is a section 75 partnership agreement with NHS Walsall. This agreement sets out the arrangements for the joint service and the corresponding pooling of resources, both staffing and financial resources. The service is managed by the Council via a Pooled Fund Manager, employed by the Council but funded in part by NHS Walsall. Contributions to the pool by each partner are agreed annually by each partner and signed off at the Partnership Executive Board. This board is formally constituted and includes finance and directors from both parties. This role will be undertaken by the Vulnerable Adults Executive Board for 2010/11.

The current split of funding to the pool is 55% from NHS Walsall and 45% from Walsall Council. Should members wish for further information, this can be provided from the Head of Joint Commissioning (Andrew Rust)

3. Draft Capital Programme 2010/11 – Social Care and Inclusion Portfolio

3.1 Cabinet on 16 December 2009 presented their draft capital programme for 2010/11 for consultation.

If grant or mainstream funding is unavailable the scheme will not proceed. At this point in time, a number of grants have not been confirmed, therefore there is likely to be some movement as the budget process progresses.

3.2 Leasing Programme

Leasing minimises the call on capital resources by spreading the acquisition cost over some years. Revenue funds are needed to finance operating leases. Assets identified

within the draft leasing programme relating to services within the remit of this panel total £0.118m and are summarised in **Appendix 3**.

3.3 Reserve List

A reserve list of schemes is in place should resources become available for new starts in 2010/11. There is one scheme identified on this reserve list that relate to services within the remit of this panel, Personalisation - Refresh of ICT and PARIS, and is shown in **Appendix 4**.

Citizen impact

The budget is aligned with service activity within service plans across the council. Investment is intended to be targeted at service improvement, stability and user influence. The report to the panel on 30 November set out the vision and priorities for the services within the remit of this panel.

Environmental impact

Services within the remit of this panel have a direct influence and impact on the environment.

Performance management

Financial performance is considered alongside service targets. Managers are required to deliver their service targets within budget, wherever possible. The report to the panel on 30 November included reference to performance management and key indicators.

Equality Implications

Services consider equality issues in setting budgets and delivering services. Irrespective of budgetary pressures the council must fulfil its equal opportunities obligations

Consultation

This is the second of two meetings for scrutiny to consider Cabinets draft budget proposals. Recommendations from the panel's first meeting on 30 November 2009 were presented to Cabinet at its meeting on 16 December 2009. This meeting provides the panel with a further opportunity to consider the revised draft revenue budget and first draft capital programme 2010/11 and make recommendations for Cabinet to consider prior to Cabinet proposing the final budget for 2010/11 at its meeting on 3 February 2010.
