- 2.1 The Administration has placed the Resilient Communities philosophy at the heart of its approach to securing a cleaner, greener, safer and stronger borough. Alongside this, people's feeling of safety and the environment in which they live are key drivers of resident satisfaction, one of the three Proud promises.
