RE: ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR WORKING GROUP

Purpose

To consider and approve the terms of reference for the Anti-Social Behaviour Working Group.

Report

At its meeting on 10 June 2008 the Neighbourhoods Scrutiny and Performance Panel (NSPP) resolved to appoint a working group to consider anti-social behaviour (ASB).

A meeting of the working group took place on 22 July 2008 to consider and draft its terms of reference. A copy of the draft terms of reference is attached at appendix 1 to this report for the approval of the full Panel.

ASB is not a problem that Walsall Council can solve in isolation. Due to the importance of partnership working in solving the wide and varied ASB problems in the borough that the working group is proposing to appoint a range of co-opted advisors from the Police, Walsall Housing Group, Children's Services and Health Services to provide them with expert advice throughout their considerations. Invitations to individuals will be sent from the working groups Lead Member shortly.

Due the appointment of a range of co-opted advisors the working group proposes appointing a core Councillor membership of 4 to the working group. Following last weeks working group meeting this is proposed to be: P. Bott, L. Beeley, D. Pitt and C. Towe.

The terms of reference contains details of the proposed range of individuals and organisations that the working group would like to engage with. It is expected that this list will be added to as the working group completes its investigations.

To commence the investigations the working group propose to host a training event on ASB that will open to all Members of the Council. This is to increase understanding and awareness of ASB and role of key agencies.

Following this event the working group will hold sessions with stakeholders to establish perception of anti-social behaviour on the ground and gain a better appreciation of what is happening on the ground policy and good practice to deal with ASB.

After these sessions, the working group will meet with their co-opted advisors to review the findings and prepare report to Cabinet/Council and the Safer Walsall Borough Partnership.

Recommendations

That:

- (a) the terms of reference for the Anti-Social Behaviour Working Group be approved;
- (b) the Core Membership for the Anti-Social Working Group be approved;
- (c) a Lead Member for the Anti-Social Behaviour Working Group be appointed; and;
- (d) the organisations to invite to appoint co-opted advisors to the Anti-Social Working Group be approved.
