


# Bloxwich Hospital Proposals

# Background

Older adult mental health inpatient services are currently provided at Bloxwich Hospital across two wards:

- Cedars 20 beds, both genders (functional disorders such as bi-polar, schizophrenia)
- Linden 16 beds, both genders (organic disorders such as dementia)




## **Background – redesign of OA MH services**

- Focus on strengthening care in the community
- Support, care treatment as early as possible
- Care tailored to individual needs
- Professionals working together across agencies
- An increase in evidence-based treatments

Final stage is to look at future requirements for inpatient beds including numbers and location

## **Case for change**

- Bloxwich Hospital is not purpose built
- Layout can provide challenges in providing the right type of space for patients
- Struggles to meet mixed accommodation standards
- Our commissioners / regulators are keen for us to explore other options
- Building maintenance is costly




#### Proposal

To relocate the two wards to new purpose built accommodation at Dorothy Pattison Hospital:

- 15 functional beds
- 10 Organic beds

The proposals will see a reduction in bed numbers




# **Benefits**

- Modern, purpose built accommodation
- Meets requirements for same sex accommodation
- Wider group of staff to respond to incidents
- Adjacent to Walsall Manor Hospital
- Access to DPH site facilities gym, canteen
- Good car parking / public transport access
- No disruption to patients / staff during build

#### **Engagement – target groups**


Important to engage with a number of groups to obtain their views / comments before the business case is developed.


Views were sought from staff, patients, carers, family members, members of the public, older age local groups, Experts by Experience

Created engagement document, posters and flyers detailing plans and highlighting a number of routes to feedback






## **Engagement - methods**

We used a variety of methods to invite feedback:

- Posters / flyers
- Comment boxes at Bloxwich Hospital, Dorothy Pattison Hospital and Walsall Manor
- Invited feedback from staff at face to face briefing sessions, Trust internal communications channels
- Promoted engagement document on Trust website

## **Engagement – methods continued**

- Face to Face at weekly Time to Remember and Social Hour for patients and carers at Bloxwich Hospital
- Have offered one to one appointments to patients, carers / families if required
- Promoted at the Dementia Cafes in Walsall




#### Feedback

There was little feedback received on proposals. Themes can be summarised below:

Staff: Broadly supportive, questions around future use of building e.g. other teams to utilise

Patients: Concerns around transport, number of beds, positive about possible ground floor wards
