Amendment moved by Councillor Oliver and seconded by Councillor S. Coughlan:

In receiving these budget proposals it is noted that the Conservative and Liberal Democrat coalition government has imposed on Walsall Council budget cuts in excess of 30% of our revenue budget over a three year period (to a cumulative total of over £84 million to date and rising, a figure which would be in excess of £100 million if the current floor damping formula had not been applied). We believe that these budget cuts go too far and too fast, and furthermore to be disproportionate to local government as a whole and to our borough in particular.

This Council instructs that the following policy priorities and principles should underpin the implementation of budget decisions:

- To protect the needs of the most vulnerable client or communities
- To protect services within the most disadvantaged neighbourhoods.

With regard to the provision of a free community alarm service to all residents over 80 years of age resident in the Borough and to investigate the possible extension of this service to other vulnerable adults, the following **amendment** was moved by Councillor S. Coughlan and duly seconded:

That the statutory determinations for both gross expenditure and gross income be increased by £811,860 to cover the cost of this in 2012/13.

(The total cost of the amendment to be funded from general reserves in 2012/13. Ongoing funding to be determined and identified as part of the 2013/14 exercise.)

- £190,905 of pump priming investment with potential to attract match funding from partner agencies (youth ASB intervention model, youth activity programme and Myplace youth enterprise)
- £280,924 to extend the pilot in the Benefits service to support tenants following changes in housing benefit regulations and to process the significant increase in discretionary housing payment applications.)
