Description

This joint event brings together the expertise of the Local Government Information Unit and the Democratic Health Network to explore the linkages, tensions and possible solutions in two key policy concerns for central and local government. First, the need to support vulnerable people (including drug and alcohol users, people with mental health problems and young people at risk of social exclusion) to live independently in the community and second, the need to promote safer communities as part of the government's respect agenda. Often, these two policy strands are seen as conflicting, with the rights of the individual to live as part of the community set against the rights of the wider community to live free from anti-social behaviour and harassment. This seminar will include:

- an overview of the policy framework for central and local government for crime reduction and community safety, and for promoting the social inclusion of vulnerable people
- identifying the tensions and challenges for local government and their partners inherent in this complex policy area
- good practice examples from local authorities and their partners
- discussion of the role of elected members as community leaders, catalysts for local partnership working and as mediators between conflicting interests.
