#### **1.0 Summary of Report**

- 1.1 For members of the licensing sub committee to determine an application for a premises licence in respect of Costcutter, 15 Old Birchills, Walsall, WS2 8QH.
- 1.2 The application is made by M & M Family Two Limited, the application has been submitted by solicitors on their behalf.
- 1.3 The application cannot be granted or refused under officer's delegated authority following relevant representations received by the licensing authority.

#### **2.0 Recommendations**

- 2.1 That the Licensing Sub Committee determine whether the application for a premises licence in respect of Costcutter, 15 Old Birchills, Walsall, WS2 8QH be granted as requested, granted with additional/modified conditions, or reject the application.

#### **3.0 Background information**

- 3.1 An application for a premises licence was received on 10<sup>th</sup> April 2018 by the Licensing Authority.
- 3.2 The completed application which also includes the proposed layout of the premises is given as **Appendix 1**. The applicant has in Section M of the application identified the steps they intend to take in order to promote the licensing objectives, if the application is granted as requested these would become conditions of licence.





3.3 A summary of the proposed activities and times are as follows:

- 3.4 A street map of the locality is attached as **Appendix 2**.
- 3.5 Should members resolve to grant the application, Vykunthan Nadarasa has nominated himself as the Designated Premises Supervisor (see Appendix 1).
- 3.6 Copies of the licence application must be submitted to all statutory 'responsible authorities' under the terms of the Act.
- 3.7 Applications for a premises licence are also required to be advertised by way of a blue site notice displayed at the premises, and a licensing notice placed in a newspaper circulating within the area. This ensures that 'other persons' (regardless of their status or geographic proximity to the premises) under the terms of the Act are aware of the licence application. The Licensing Authority must also advertise the application on its website during the consultation period.
- 3.8 Any responsible authority or other persons has 28 days from submission of the application to make a written relevant representation to the Licensing Authority.
- 3.9 There have been no representations to the application made by responsible authorities objecting against the grant of the application.
- 3.10 During the consultation period the Licensing Authority has received 6 'relevant' representations to the application from other persons objecting to the grant of the licence on the grounds of Crime & Disorder, Public Nuisance, Public Safety and Protection of Children From Harm. Copies of the representations can be found attached as **Appendix 3**.
- 3.11 The licensing authority has received 3 forms of petition from local residents objecting against the grant of the application on the grounds of Crime & Disorder, Public Nuisance, Public Safety and Protection of Children From Harm. Copies of the petitions can be found attached as **Appendix 4**.



#### 4.0 Issues

- 4.1 The premises does not fall within the councils' cumulative impact area, therefore the cumulative impact policy does not apply to this application.

#### 5.0 Resource Considerations

- 5.1 **Financial:** Application fees are set by central government and are non refundable. Should the application be refused by the Sub-committee, there is a right of appeal to Magistrates Court. Should an appeal be successful the Magistrates may make an order for costs to the council.
- 5.2 **Legal:** Any representations received must be relevant to the likely effect on the promotion of the licensing objectives in respect of the application received, namely: prevention of Crime and Disorder, Public Safety, Prevention of Public Nuisance, Protection of Children from Harm. Representations which are not relevant must be rejected.

The Licensing Authority upon receipt of relevant representations and only if it is considered to be appropriate to promote the licensing objectives may consider attaching additional conditions, modifying existing conditions as given in the operating schedule, or to reject the application.

The Guidance issued under section 182, paragraph 9.30 states: "The licensing authority may also decide to withhold some or all of the person's personal details from the applicant, giving only minimal details (such as street name or general location within a street). However, withholding such details should only be considered where the circumstances justify such action.

Licensing authorities should look to the police as the main source of advice on crime and disorder. They should also seek to involve the local Community Safety Partnership (CSP).

Walsall Council has stated that at all times the Licensing Authority will try to strike a fair balance between the benefits to the community of a licensed venue and the risk of disturbance to local residents.

It should be noted, however, that the Licensing Act 2003 is not the primary mechanism for the general control of nuisance and anti-social behaviour by individuals once they are away from the licensed premises and therefore, beyond the direct control of the business holding the licence. Any imposed conditions should be focused on measures within the direct control of the licence holder.

Guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 states "The 2003 Act enables licensing authorities and responsible authorities, through representations, to consider what constitutes public nuisance and what is appropriate to prevent it in terms of conditions attached to specific premises licences and club premises certificates. It is therefore important that in considering the promotion of



this licensing objective, licensing authorities and responsible authorities focus on the effect of the licensable activities at the specific premises on persons living and working (including those carrying on business) in the area around the premises which may be disproportionate and unreasonable. The issues will mainly concern noise nuisance, light pollution, noxious smells and litter.

Paragraph 2.3 of the guidance states “Conditions should be targeted on deterrence and preventing crime and disorder including the prevention of illegal working in licensed premises (see paragraph 10.10). For example, where there is good reason to suppose that disorder may take place, the presence of closed-circuit television (CCTV) cameras both inside and immediately outside the premises can actively deter disorder, nuisance, anti-social behaviour and crime generally. Some licence holders may wish to have cameras on their premises for the prevention of crime directed against the business itself, its staff, or its customers. But any condition may require a broader approach, and it may be appropriate to ensure that the precise location of cameras is set out on plans to ensure that certain areas are properly covered and there is no subsequent dispute over the terms of the condition”.

The Licensing Sub Committee must have due regard to the Licensing Authorities licensing policy statement, and the statutory guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003.

The Licensing Sub Committee may grant the application as requested, grant with additional/modified conditions attached to the premises licence or reject the application.

Where the applicant, responsible authority, or other persons is aggrieved by the decision of the Licensing Authority, appeal is to Magistrates Court where the reasonableness or otherwise of the decision will be tested.

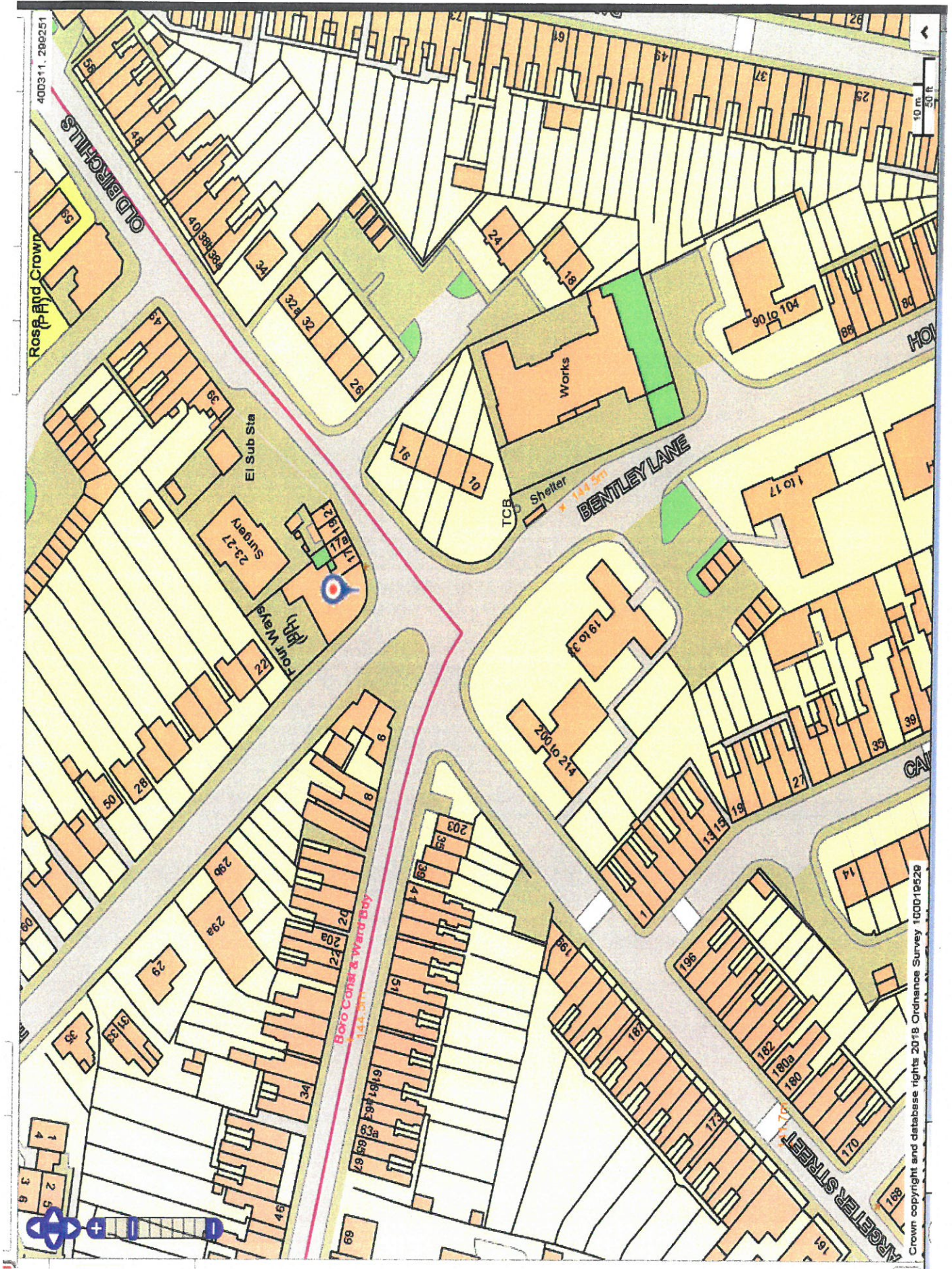

I note with some concern that M and M Family Two Ltd have applied for a licence to sell alcohol from 06.00 to 23.00 from a Costcutter shop at 15 Old Birchills, WS2 8QH for seven days a week. My concern is for the following reasons:

Anti social behavior in the area will most likely increase. When a store a little further along Old Birchills started selling alcohol there was an increase in noise, alcohol related rubbish (worse being glass bottles, often smashed, and that can be used in fights), and violence. Groups of youngsters started hanging around causing minor problems. This in turn attracts the drug dealers.

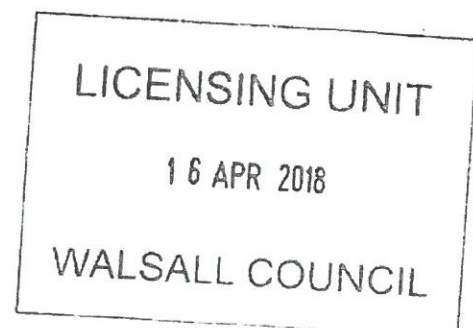
For people in Reedswood Lane, with the shop that used to be there, parking caused problems. We are writing to register our objection to the application for a premises licence by M & M Family Two Limited, Registered Office 17 Markham Crescent, Solihull, West Midlands, B92 0PF. The basis for our opposition is that granting a licence for these premises will not promote the licensing objectives, particularly the prevention of crime, disorder and antisocial behaviour. The application proposes that alcohol will be sold for consumption off the premises between the hours of 6am and 11pm, seven days a week. Granting a licence would provide a further source of alcohol within an area already so heavily populated with licensed premises that crime, disorder and public nuisance have already reached problem levels for the local police. Residents in this area already suffer littering, drug dealing, noise nuisance and antisocial behaviour at all hours of the day and night. They have endured the inconvenience since 2003 when the licensing legislation was amended and it is totally unacceptable to expect them to continue to do so.

We would ask the Committee to consider the amount of smashed alcohol bottles which litter the pavements of the Birchills and Reedswood and are not removed. Alcohol containers litter the streets. Black bin liners and bags of alcohol tins and bottles are flytipped in Reedswood Park and are not removed. Wherever there is a food or drink outlet in the Borough there is a predominance of litter consisting of drinks containers and non biodegradable food packaging. The nearby Birchills shopping parade is filthy as are the surrounding streets. The Council finds it impossible to clean these areas as it is a built up area consisting of streets of terraced housing and parked cars. Cars are permanently parked in upper Bentley Lane near to the proposed off-licence and the gutters and pavements are rarely mechanically swept as the machines cannot gain access.

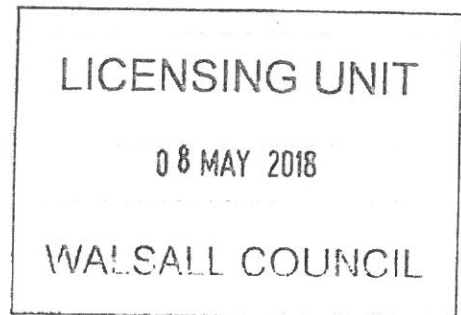

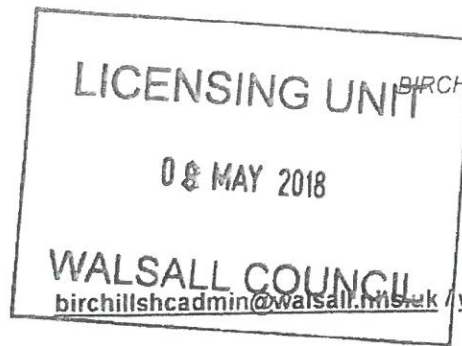

**We at Birchills Health Centre are writing in objection to the application for an Alcohol Licence at 15 Old Birchills, WS2 8QH, the "Four Ways," CostCutter.**

Birchills Health Centre offers many community based services whilst also treating patients who require on-going and continued healthcare. We serve patients from a wide ranging demographic population to include all ages.

One of the Health & Safety challenges that we face is traffic in our immediate area. Entering and exiting our car park via Old Birchills road can be challenging during peak times with patients forced to park some way away due to cars being inappropriately parked on Old Birchills road.

The Four Ways building (15 Old Birchills) is next to our patient car park. We feel that its location may cause unnecessary disruption to the running of our practice as a result of their customers need to park their cars. When a previous business operated at this location, we had multiple instances of their customers using our car park which adversely affected our patients. We also observed careless parking from patrons of the previous shop. There were many instances of double parking and the blocking of access to the road by cars being parked directly in the road. This caused much distress to the residents of Old Birchills, Reedswood Lane and people passing through. We have no doubt that if a licence is granted to this premises our problems will substantially worsen.

We have also noticed an increase in anti-social behaviour from youths and adults in the area. They frequently congregate in groups along the road which makes residents and patients uneasy as their very nature is aggressive. We have already had anti-loitering campaigns run in the area to try and decrease this type of behaviour. Granting an alcohol licence at this premises and allowing a business such as the one proposed to be opened will have a negative effect on the area. We have a long history of complaints to West Midlands Police of anti-social behaviour on our premises which includes vandalism due to alcohol intoxication.

Our surrounding area has major problems with nuisance littering. Our Health Centre car park needs to be continually swept because of littering which quite often involves broken alcohol bottles. A licensed shop situated just meters away will just increase this nuisance.

We strongly feel that granting a licence next to the Birchills Health Centre would be highly detrimental and adversely affect our local community.

I strongly oppose the application for a licensed premises at 15 Old Birchills. As a community we face enough problems as it is. We have groups of anti-social people loitering already and causing a nuisance to the area. If a licence is granted here it will only increase, it will give these people another place to congregate and loiter. The road also suffers from anti-social behaviour whereby groups of young adults with cars park along the street at night and drink in the parked up cars. They shout and scream and rev engines making local residents feel unsafe in their own homes. At the same time, they throw all their rubbish directly onto the road, things like takeaway wrappers, bottles and glass smashed onto the pavements and road. Drink driving is also a big problem; we regularly get tyres screeching at night with huge tyre marks all up the road where these people have been skidding around. If another alcohol licence is granted at the top of the road it will just get worse.

I have also had problems to the point where I have spent huge amounts of money on CCTV to protect my home. I have frequently caught drunk people Urinating on my house at night, this is unbearable. I have installed CCTV to catch and ultimately deter them from doing so, it is slowly working. We do not need another alcohol outlet making it even more convenient to obtain, it will only negate the advances we have made as a community and encourage more of this anti-social behaviour. I also fear for the families living only doors away from 15 Old Birchills, they will start experiencing this sort of thing if a licence is granted. Maybe even worse as people will be encouraged to drink in Reedswood Park, so street drinking will become the normal along Reedswood Lane. Crime and violence is also becoming the status quo; multiple vehicles along the road were fire bombed last month, we don't need more alcohol to fuel this.

What is especially worrying about this location is the traffic/parking here. It is horrendous already. Literally as I write this, a wall sits completely demolished by a car mounting the curb at speed, jumping the pavement and crashing into the wall. Children, families and the general public use these pavements & roads all day, this crash happened in broad daylight, it would have been instant multiple fatality had people been in front of the wall. This is without a high traffic/parking turnover business operating there, never mind a licenced one. The road at 15 Old Birchills is also dangerous enough with the way its laid out,

extremely poor visibility on all the junctions directly outside the property. With constant cars parking up to use the licenced premises all day and careless drivers blocking the road and double parking it would only increase the chances of a fatal incident.

**Petition opposing notice of application for a Premises Licence made by "M&M Family Two Limited"  
for a "Costcutter" store at 15 Old Birchills, Walsall, WS2 8QH.**

To The Licencing Unit, Walsall Council, Civic Centre, Walsall, WS1 1TP, and whomever else it may concern,

We, the undersigned, believe that a store/business at this location, in this community is neither wanted or needed by the majority of local residents, least of all another outlet in the community selling alcohol through the day until late into the night. There are multiple Convenience Stores, Newsagents, Off Licences, Butchers, Pubs/On Licence premises within a short distance in the area, the community is running at capacity. We need a great deal more than another Licenced Premises. Residential Housing/Apartments/Flats are needed and are much better suited to this premises (15 Old Birchills, WS2 8QH).

The location is on the corner of Old Birchills and Reedswood Lane/Bentley Lane/Hollyhedge Lane, the junction/15 Old Birchills is locally known as the "Four Ways." In February 2007, an application to open a "Restaurant & Takeaway" here was submitted, Application Number:07/0318/FL/W3. This was rejected for a number of reasons and was refused by Walsall council. However, this premises disregarded the council decision and continued ahead and opened as "Bake 'n' Bite" and further more as a retail/convenience store at the same time, all despite council refusal, this also suggesting the fact the application (07/0318/FL/W3) was falsely submitted and a restaurant/takeaway/café/fish and chip shop was not the real intention for the main business at the location, it was instead a convenience store. This retail convenience store business caused havoc for residents living on all four roads surrounding 15 Old Birchills/"The Four Ways Public House." Residents leaving and entering Reedswood Lane had serious ongoing problems with safe access and exit from the road due to customers parking badly and illegally, most of the time totally obstructing visibility to the point it was a hazard and danger to enter or exit at the junction, many times cars were completely blocking off the road completely for residents and the local community wanting to access Reedswood Park. Problems like this will arise again with a high traffic/parking/re-parking turnover if any business was to reopen at the location, never mind a licenced premises such as "CostCutter" opening. The junction itself can't cope with current conditions, multiple traffic collisions have occurred outside and that's without a licensed store's traffic adding to the chaos. The junction of Bentley Lane/Old Birchills is already a bottle neck creating traffic, and Reedswood Lane/Old Birchills is a dangerous junction already with extremely poor visibility. Directly outside the Birchills Health Centre on Old Birchills next to 15 Old Birchills the roads narrow to a point where only one car can pass safely when cars are parked up legally on the road side. Also the necessary and respected Birchills Health Centre, which is an essential part of the area serving the near and extended community, has crucial traffic from patients and staff accessing and exiting the Health Centre car park; another junction directly opposite the Birchills Health centre provides access to the rear of the houses along Old Birchills and more houses set inside this close. All told there are 6 high traffic turnings/junctions within feet of each other all surrounding 15 Old Birchills, these include Pargeter Street/Bentley Lane, Bentley Lane/Old Birchills, Old Birchills/Reedswood Lane, Old Birchills/Birchills Health Centre, Old Birchills/Rear access to houses and in-set houses along Old Birchills, Old Birchills/Reedswood Close. It is also necessary to look at the larger picture regarding high traffic problems in the area. Whenever an incident occurs on the M6/Junction 10, bumper to bumper tailbacks

occur up Hollyhedge Lane/Bentley Lane and on through across Old Birchills up to Green Lane/A34, all from drivers wanting to divert and avoid the mass build ups along the M6 and Black Country Routes. A business here fuelling more traffic would be calamitous.

There is at present also enough Anti-Social Behaviour in the area with multiple gangs of adults and youths loitering and causing a nuisance to residents and passers-by, another retail/convenience outlet and one that sells alcohol will only add fuel to the fire. At this present time the Police are already unable to provide patrols or a presence whatsoever in the area, we have also seen PCSOs (Police Community Support Officers) patrols totally scrapped. Gangs of youths/adults also meet with multiple cars parking up playing loud music/shouting/littering in the areas along Old Birchills, Reedswood Lane, Bentley Lane, and Hollyhedge Lane. Another retail store, and a Licenced Premises at that, running all day into the late night will encourage more of this behaviour and create havoc for local residents and families living here by creating an anchor point for more of it to happen. In the last month (March 2018) Old Birchills and Birchills Street saw Multiple vehicles (Mini Buses and Cars) Petrol/Fire Bombed along the road, these took place shortly after 9.30pm all on the same night with members of the public walking around, one of the mini buses was parked less than 30 feet away from the "Four Ways"/15 Old Birchills. Residents and young families were scared for their lives as the mini buses exploded multiple times after being petrol bombed, causing literal shockwaves along the road and shattered glass everywhere. This is not an isolated incident, again only a matter of a few weeks later a car was Petrol/Fire bombed in the first week of April (2018) along Birchills Street with the Local Church, Birchills' Mosque, Birchills School, SureStart Nursery, takeaway outlets and existing Off Licence on the same road. Another Licenced Premises/store here at the "Four Ways PH" will just exacerbate Crime and issues like this in the community by unnecessarily attracting people to the area and causing these types of problems.

The need to actively prevent and stop the culture of street drinking and readily available alcohol increasing throughout Walsall is necessary and needs to be put into action, areas which have not done enough or acted too late to prevent this have seen a monumental increase of crime and public disorder all branching from street drinking and multiple outlets all providing easy access to alcohol. A prime example of this is in the Walsall area of Caldmore/St Matthews Ward, over time multiple businesses and licenced business were able to open and have created a melting pot of nuisance street drinking, this slowly festered into levels of crime and public disorder previously unseen, and now more worryingly, excessive hard drug use in the area, all causing residents huge amounts of grief from related crime. Too many premises with On and Off Licences in an area selling alcohol also leads to more competition on price, this in turn lures more people, youngsters and vulnerable people into taking advantage of inevitable cheap deals and promotions on alcohol. There are already 3 On-Licence premises / Pubs on Old Birchills alone with more clubs/pubs a stone's throw away in the area, multiple Off Licences also exist in the area within minutes on foot of the proposed site. The community of Birchills doesn't need more licenced premises adding to alcohol fuelled and related issues; the development of problems being seen impacting other Walsall areas from happening in our community can be stopped.

**The Prevention of Crime and Disorder.** All types of Crime are already increasing in the Birchills area, with the number of hard drug users also on the rise. Readily available Alcohol playing a part in the increase of crime that the community is seeing, more outlets are unnecessary and will only increase crime and disorder.

**The Prevention of Public Nuisance.** There are already major traffic concerns along the road and for the local residents and community, there will be indefinite increases of traffic/parking problems from any business/store/licenced premises at the location causing an increased need for frequent parking/re-parking and traffic throughout the day into the night. Residents living on Reedswood lane and Old Birchills will bear the brunt of this unwelcome nuisance.
