### Report to Brownhills/Pelsall/Rushall & Shelfield Area Panel 28 January, 2014 Funding Report

#### 1. Context

- 1.1 Following the change to the Council's Constitution, Area Panels now have the responsibility for approving any project funding applications that are received through Area Partnerships.
