Councillor Bird presented the report:

He pointed out that the recommendations should have included reference to delegated authority being given in addition to the Executive Director, Social Care and Inclusion.

The Transfer Schemes can then be submitted to the Department of Health by 29 March 2013.
- (2) That authority be delegated to the Executive Director for Neighbourhood Services, in consultation with the Leader of the Council and the Executive Director for Social Care and Inclusion, to sign and enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with the Clinical Commissioning Group for the provision of public health advice and other ancillary services.

- (3) That approval be given for the Chief Executive and Executive Director Regeneration, in consultation with portfolio holders, to participate in the Black Country negotiation with Government, and local partners, on the granting of freedoms and flexibilities for the Black Country, in return for local economic outcomes.
- (4) That approval be given for the Chief Executive and Executive Director Regeneration, in consultation with portfolio holders, to develop with Dudley, Sandwell and Wolverhampton City Councils working arrangements to deliver the City Deal proposal and sustainable mechanisms for its subsequent delivery, including robust governance arrangements.
- (5) That further reports be brought forward to update on progress and at the conclusion of the negotiation with the Government, the reports to describe the freedoms and flexibilities in negotiation, the local outcomes to be achieved and recommendations on the governance arrangements to manage the Black Country partners' joint working.

2930 Regional Growth Fund: Growing key sectors in Black Country

Councillor A. Andrew presented the report

Resolved

- (1) That Cabinet agrees to enter into the Growing Key Sectors in the Black Country Regional Growth Fund Programme Collaboration Agreement with Sandwell Council (attached as Appendix A).
- (2) That authority be delegated to the Executive Director Regeneration to sign or authorise the sealing of the proposed Collaboration Agreement for the Black Country Regional Growth Fund Programme and any related contracts, deed or documents, to be entered into by Dudley, Sandwell, Wolverhampton and Walsall Councils.
- (3) That Cabinet agrees, with regard to Sandwell Council's costs of due diligence and monitoring the Black Country Regional Growth Fund Programme in accordance with the conditions set by the Department of Business, Innovation and Skills, to the Council making:
 - (i) a contribution of £10,000; and
 - (ii) additional reasonable payments should Sandwell Council's costs be greater than £40,000.

2931 Phoenix 10 project

Councillor A. Andrew presented the report:

Resolved

- (1) That Cabinet notes the recommendations made following work undertaken by DTZ to review possible options for delivering the reclamation and development of the Phoenix 10 site (located off Darlaston Road/Reservoir Place), with the conclusion being that option 3 is the most appropriate option.
- (2) That Cabinet agrees to progress negotiations with the Homes & Communities Agency (the 'HCA') to acquire the HCA's land interest, as indicated on plan no. EMPS 3753, on terms to be agreed at its meeting on 24 April 2013.
- (3) That Cabinet approves undertaking a procurement process for technical project management support to assist delivery of the project and delegates authority to the Executive Director Regeneration to award the contract.
- (4) That Cabinet approves undertaking a procurement process for a contractor to undertake the reclamation works for the combined Phoenix 10 site by comprehensive ground excavation subject to final approval from Cabinet to award the contract.

- (5) That Cabinet endorses the submission of a formal request to the Black Country Local Enterprise Partnership Board for financial support for the reclamation of the Phoenix 10 site from anticipated business rate uplift in the Black Country Enterprise Zone.
- (6) That Cabinet agrees to receive reports to future meetings which:
 - (a) outline the proposed detailed arrangements for funding the reclamation of the Phoenix 10 site.
 - (b) seek approval to appoint a specialist reclamation works contractor.
 - (c) outline for agreement the detailed terms for the Council's acquisition of the HCA land.
 - (d) seek the necessary approvals to progress the Phoenix 10 project once the above recommendations have been acted upon.
 - (e) outline the arrangements for securing the disposal and development of the site and the management of any subsequent capital receipt

- (3) That Cabinet approves the option to use an appropriate form of procurement and contracting arrangements determined by the head of Property Services to provide the most efficient and value for money means of delivering the projects. This shall include consideration of traditional procurement and EU compliant frameworks available to local authorities.

2935 Early education capital funding

Councillor R. Andrew presented the report:

In presenting the report, Councillor Andrew emphasised that places would be provided by a range of childcare providers including childminders, across the piece to provide the widest possible offer for disadvantaged 2 year olds.

- (3) That Cabinet delegates to the Executive Director for Children's Services in consultation with the relevant Portfolio holder authority to award contracts (including authorising execution/signature of the contract and ancillary documents) to the most suitable contractors having regard to Best Value for the works/services as set out.
- (4) That Cabinet approves the option to use an appropriate form of procurement and contracting arrangements determined by the Head of Property Services to provide the most efficient and value for money means of delivering the projects. This shall include consideration of traditional procurement and EU compliant frameworks available to local authorities.

2936 Determination of admission scheme and admission arrangements

She pointed out that following a discussion with the school and head teachers in the vicinity, the admission arrangements for Lindens Primary had changed since the report had been prepared and would be increased from 45 to 52 for one year only. - (2) That the admission arrangements for primary community and voluntary controlled schools for the academic year 2014/15 as set out in Appendix B to the report be agreed with the exception of Lindens Primary where the proposed admission number is increased from 45 to 52.
- (3) That Walsall Children's Services be asked to inform all consultees of the determination of the admission arrangements for the 2014/15 academic year.

2937 Enlargement of Phoenix Special School

This proposal will increase the planned places at Phoenix Primary Special School from 30 to 36 places.

- (3) That Cabinet endorse the use of Exception Circumstances funding agreed with School Forum.
- (4) That Cabinet note that the Department for Education require these rates to be finalised by March 2013.

2939 Future arrangements for the provision of education support and services

2946 Lease of land at Vernon Way to National Construction College

 - (a) Department for Education (DfE) consent is forthcoming for the disposal of the site under section 77 of the 1998 Act.
 - (b) CITB secure planning consent for the development of the College.
 - (c) The DfE funding agreement for the West Midlands Construction UTC is completed.
 - (d) The lease contains obligations on CITB to construct the National Construction College facility within an agreed timescale.
 - (e) The lease containing restrictions preventing the use of the land for any purpose other than a National Construction College.
- (2) That approval be given to the disposal of the site at less than best consideration on the grounds that the College will provide social and economic benefits through the establishment of a centre of excellence in the construction training sector.
- (3) That authority be delegated to the Executive Director for Regeneration in conjunction with the Cabinet portfolio holder for Regeneration to approve the terms for the disposal of the long leasehold interest in the site.
- (4) That the sum of £53,000 be allocated from capital funds to fund the school sports provision required under section 77 of the 1998 Act.
