1.0 Summary of Report

- 1.1 For members of the licensing sub-committee to determine an application for a premises licence variation in respect of Pelsall Cricket Club. The application has been submitted by Ian Rushton on behalf of Pelsall Cricket and Sports Club who are the premises licence holders.
- 1.2 The application cannot be granted or refused under officer's delegated authority.
- 1.3 No relevant representations have been received from responsible authorities under the Act objecting to the grant of the variation.
- 1.4 The Licensing Authority are in receipt of 2 relevant representations from "other persons" objecting to the grant of the variation.

2.0 Recommendations

- 2.1 That the licensing sub-committee determine whether the application for a premises licence variation in respect of Pelsall Cricket Club, Walsall Road, Pelsall, Walsall, WS3 4BP be granted as requested, granted with additional/ modified conditions, or reject the application

3.0 Background Information

- 3.1 Pelsall Cricket & Sports Club was granted a premises licence on the Licensing Act 2003 on the 24th November 2005. The current premises licence is given as **Appendix 1**.

3.2 An application for a premises licence variation was received on 4th July 2023 by the licensing authority. The variation application and plan is given as **Appendix 2** (only the relevant pages have been reproduced).

3.3 The application seeks to expand the licensable activities to the outside field adjacent to the premises where a maximum 10 events will be held throughout each calendar year. Each external event will be subject to discussion at the Walsall Safety Advisory Group with responsible authorities prior to the event going ahead. Table below outlines the existing operating schedule together with the proposed operating schedule:

- 3.4 Attached as **Appendix 3** are the proposed conditions volunteered by the licence holders to form part of the operating schedule should members grant the variation application.
- 3.5 A street map of the locality is attached as **Appendix 4**.
- 3.6 Copies of the licence variation application must be submitted to all statutory 'responsible authorities' under the terms of the Act.
- 3.7 Applications for a premises licence variation are also required to be advertised by way of a blue site notice displayed at the premises, and a licensing notice placed in a newspaper circulating within the area. This ensures that 'other persons' (regardless of their geographic proximity to the premises) under the terms of the Act are aware of the licence application.
- 3.8 Any responsible authority or other person has 28 days from submission of the application to make a written relevant representation to the licensing authority.

4. Representations

4.1 Representations/Responses from Responsible Authorities

The Licensing Authority received the following responses to the consultation from responsible authorities:

Walsall Council Public Health

On the 6 July 2023 Public Health responded to the consultation with no comments. A copy of the response is added as **Appendix 5**.

Community Protection

On the 6 July 2023 Walsall Council's Community Protection (delegated by Environmental Health for Noise Issues) responded to the consultation by informing the Licensing Authority that they were happy with the proposed operating schedule which includes the proposed conditions and they had no comments or concerns in relation to the application. A copy of the response is attached as **Appendix 6**.

West Midlands Police

On 7 July 2023 the Police Licensing Officer confirmed that West Midlands Police have no concerns to the application following the completion of their enquiries. A copy of the response is attached as **Appendix 7**.

4.2 Representations from 'other persons'

The Licensing Authority are in receipt of 2 representations from residents (William Humphries & A Forrest) objecting to the grant of the variation on the grounds of Crime & Disorder and Public Nuisance. A copy of the representations are attached as **Appendix 8**.

5. Cumulative Impact Policy

- 5.1 The premises does not fall within the Cumulative Impact Area (CIP). Therefore the CIP does not apply to the application for determination.

7. Resource Considerations

- 7.1 **Financial:** Any decision taken by the Licensing Authority may be appealed to the Magistrates' Court. The Licensing Authority would have to bear the costs of defending such an appeal.
- 7.2 **Legal:** Any representations received must be relevant to the likely effect on the promotion of the licensing objectives in respect of the application received, namely: Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Public Safety, Prevention of Public Nuisance, Protection of Children from Harm. Representations which are not relevant must be rejected.

The Licensing Authority upon receipt of relevant representations and only if it is considered to be appropriate to promote the licensing objectives may consider attaching additional conditions, modifying existing conditions as given in the operating schedule, or to reject the application.

Any conditions further imposed by the Committee must be appropriate and should be tailored to the size, style, characteristics and activities taking place at the premises. They should not be merely aspirational and should not go further than what is required for that purpose.

Walsall Council has stated that at all times the Licensing Authority will try to strike a fair balance between the benefits to the community of a licensed venue and the risk of disturbance to local residents.

It should be noted, however, that the Licensing Act 2003 is not the primary mechanism for the general control of nuisance and anti-social behaviour by individuals once they are away from the licensed premises and therefore, beyond the direct control of the business

holding the licence. Any imposed condition should be focused on measures within the direct control of the licence holder.

The Licensing Sub Committee must have due regard to the statute, its statement of licensing policy, and the statutory guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003.

The statutory guidance at 9.4 states in part that 'For representations in relation to variations to be relevant, they should be confined to the subject matter of the variation'.

Section 35 (5) of the 2003 Act states in part that relevant representations are about the likely effect of the grant of the application on the promotion of the licensing objectives.

Paragraph 2.1 of Section 182 Guidance issued under the Licensing Act 2003 states:

"Licensing authorities should look to the police as the main source of advice on crime & disorder".

Paragraph 9.12 of section 182 guidance issued under the Licensing Act 2003 states:

"Each responsible authority will be an expert in their respective field, and in some cases it is likely that a particular responsible authority will be the licensing authority's main source of advice in relation to a particular licensing objective. For example, the police have a key role in managing the night-time economy and should have good working relationships with those operating in their local area. The police should usually therefore be the licensing authority's main source of advice on matters relating to the promotion of the crime and disorder licensing objective".

The Licensing Sub Committee may grant the application as requested, grant with additional/modified conditions attached to the premises licence or reject the application.

Where the applicant, responsible authority, or other person is aggrieved by the decision of the Licensing Authority, appeal is to Magistrates Court where the reasonableness or otherwise of the decision will be tested.

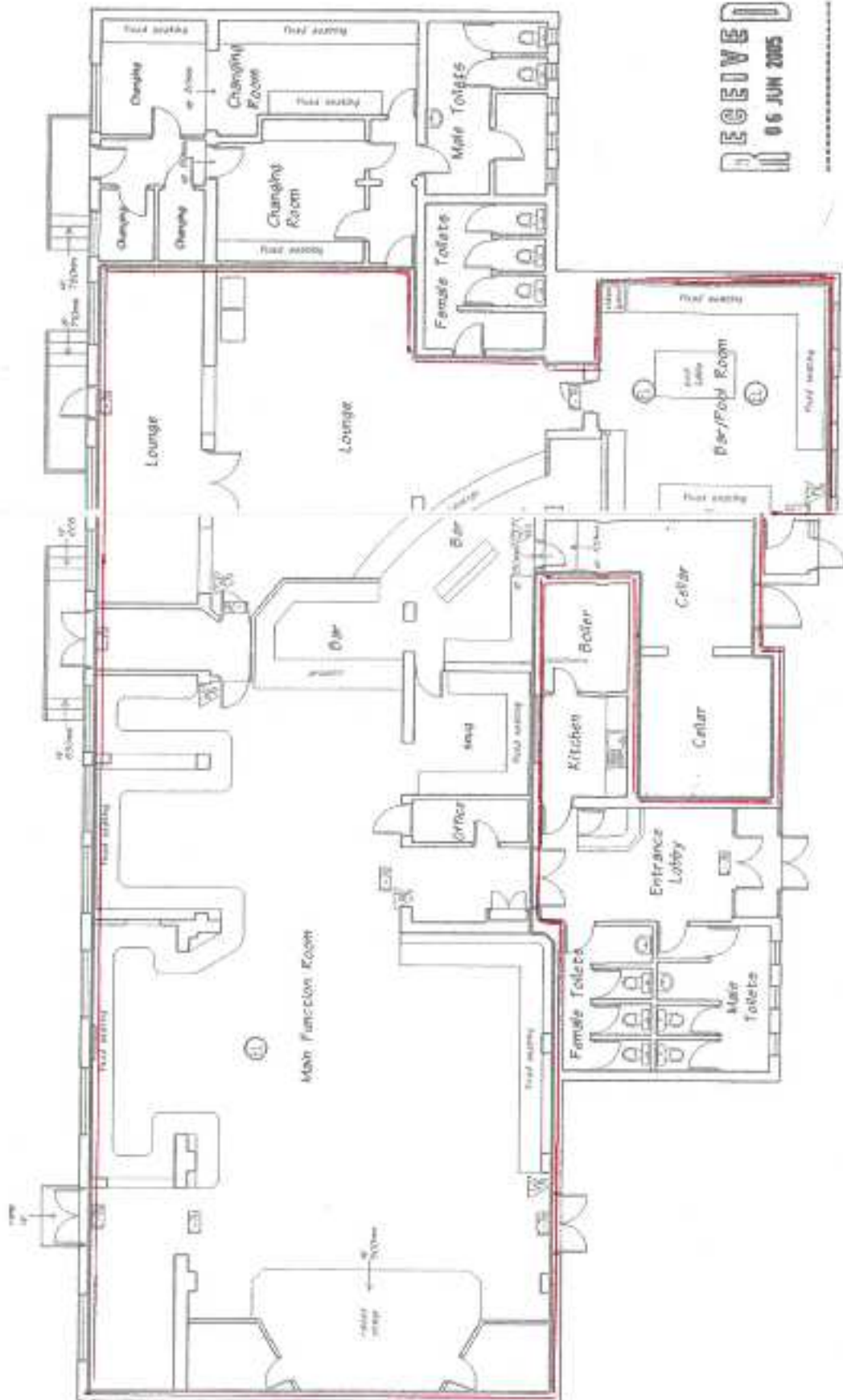

Pelsall Cricket Club is a well-established and popular club which is an important part of the local community.

There is a clubhouse, lounge, function room, and a bar(s), and they host various activities such as Zumba keep fit, Folk club, band practice, Summer sports camps for children, baby and toddler sessions, and of course cricket.

The club has been licensed for many years, operating under both a Premises Licence and a Club Premises Certificate (CPC). The premises is well managed and has a good track record of operating responsibly and promoting the licensing objectives.

This application seeks to vary the Premises Licence to allow occasional licensable activities/events to take place outdoors on the adjacent cricket field, and to also update the current activities and permitted times. The CPC will be retained as it is.

A limited number of outdoor events on the cricket field will be carefully considered and planned having regard to the nature and type of event. There will be an absolute maximum of 10 outdoor events and the Safety Advisory Group will be made aware of such events, as appropriate.

Pelsall Cricket Club, Walsall Road, Pelsall, Walsall WS3 4BP

Proposed Operating Schedule

Pelsall Cricket Club is a well-established and popular club which is an important part of the local community. There is a clubhouse, lounge, function room, and a bar(s), and they host various activities such as Zumba keep fit, Folk club, band practice, Summer sports camps for children, baby and toddler sessions, and of course cricket.

The club has been licensed for many years, operating under both a Premises Licence and a Club Premises Certificate (CPC). The premises is well managed and has a good track record of operating responsibly and promoting the licensing objectives.

This application seeks to vary the Premises Licence to allow occasional licensable activities/events to take place outdoors on the adjacent cricket field, and to also update the current activities and permitted times. The CPC will be retained as it is.

A limited number of outdoor events on the cricket field will be carefully considered and planned having regard to the nature and type of event. There will be an absolute maximum of 10 outdoor events and the Safety Advisory Group will be made aware of such events, as appropriate.

This operating schedule has been put together having regard to the the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy and the Home Office Guidance. It is designed to be comprehensive, robust and proportionate to ensure the licensing objectives are promoted.

Any comments and reasonable suggestions for strengthening the proposals will of course be welcomed and considered.

Prevention of crime and disorder

CCTV must be installed and cover all internal areas, including all public entry and exit points and any areas where smokers are allowed to congregate. The CCTV unit must be positioned in a secure part of the licensed premises.

Access to the system must be allowed immediately to the Police and other authorised officers of the Licensing Authority in accordance with the Data Protection Act where it is

necessary to do so for the prevention of crime and disorder, prosecution or apprehension of offenders or where disclosure is required by law.

The CCTV system must be maintained so as to be fully operational and recording continually whilst the premises are providing licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. A member of staff trained in the use of the CCTV system shall be available when the premises is providing licensable activities.

All images must be kept for a consecutive 31 day period.

There must be notices displayed on the premises stating that CCTV is in operation.

(CCCTV conditions relate to the indoor part of the premises)

An incident log must be kept at the premises and made available on request to the Police or other authorised officers. It must be completed within 24 hours of the incident and must record the following:

All crimes reported to the premises; All ejections of patrons
Any complaints received concerning crime and disorder, and noise
Any incidents or disorder; Any seizures of drug or offensive weapons
Any visits from Responsible Authorities

The premises has a zero tolerance to drugs - staff shall be vigilant with the aim of ensuring that no drugs are being used or brought onto the premises.

All staff involved in the sale of alcohol shall be authorised to sell alcohol in writing and a record of the authorisation will be kept on site available for inspection.

A staff training scheme shall be used for all staff authorised to sell alcohol. The training will cover responsible alcohol retailing, the licensing objectives, and Challenge 25. Training will be completed on initial appointment and refresher training will be provided annually, records will be kept and be made available to responsible authorities

Any alcohol sold for consumption off the premises will be provided in a sealed container.

Public safety

A first aid kit shall be kept on site and available for use

(note - the PLH is aware of the need to comply with other legislative requirements to ensure that the premises are safe for customers and staff).

Prevention of public nuisance

Notice(s) must be prominently displayed at all exits requesting customers to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.

Staff will assist to ensure that customers disperse in a swift, efficient and safe manner.

Music will be played with consideration for neighbours in the vicinity of the club - the music shall be played at such a level so that any sound audible from the nearest premises would not be considered unreasonable for the time of day or night.

Any complaints received regarding music/noise will be logged and recorded in the incident book.

Protection of children from harm

A challenge 25 scheme must operate at the premises whereby any person who appears to be under 25 years of age and unknown to the staff member serving as a person over 18 years of age shall not serve alcohol unless they provide identification to prove they are over 18 years of age.

The only acceptable forms of identification allowed are a valid passport, a valid photo ID driving license or a valid proof of age scheme card with the PASS approved hologram.

Challenge 25 signage must be displayed in a clear and prominent place at the premises.

A refusals register must be held at the premises and contain details of the time and date of any sales that are refused in relation to persons that are underage. This register must be made available for inspection upon request by a Responsible Authority. This register can be written or electronic.

Outdoor events on the field

Outdoor events involving the provision of licensable activities will have regard to the event safety and planning information provided by the Council (as shown on the Council's website);

Each such event will be given careful consideration by the club and risk assessed having regard to the type, nature and scale of the event, the anticipated audience including numbers and likely customer profile, and the hours of operation.

The club has experience of running events such as firework displays, and the Safety Advisory Group will be made aware of such events as appropriate.

Further conditions proposed specifically for the outdoor area (the field)

There shall be a maximum of 10 licensable events each year on the field.

There shall be no more than 3 licensable events on the field with a capacity of over 499 people and live amplified music provided. Event plans will be in place for such events.

The Safety Advisory Group will be made aware of such events as appropriate

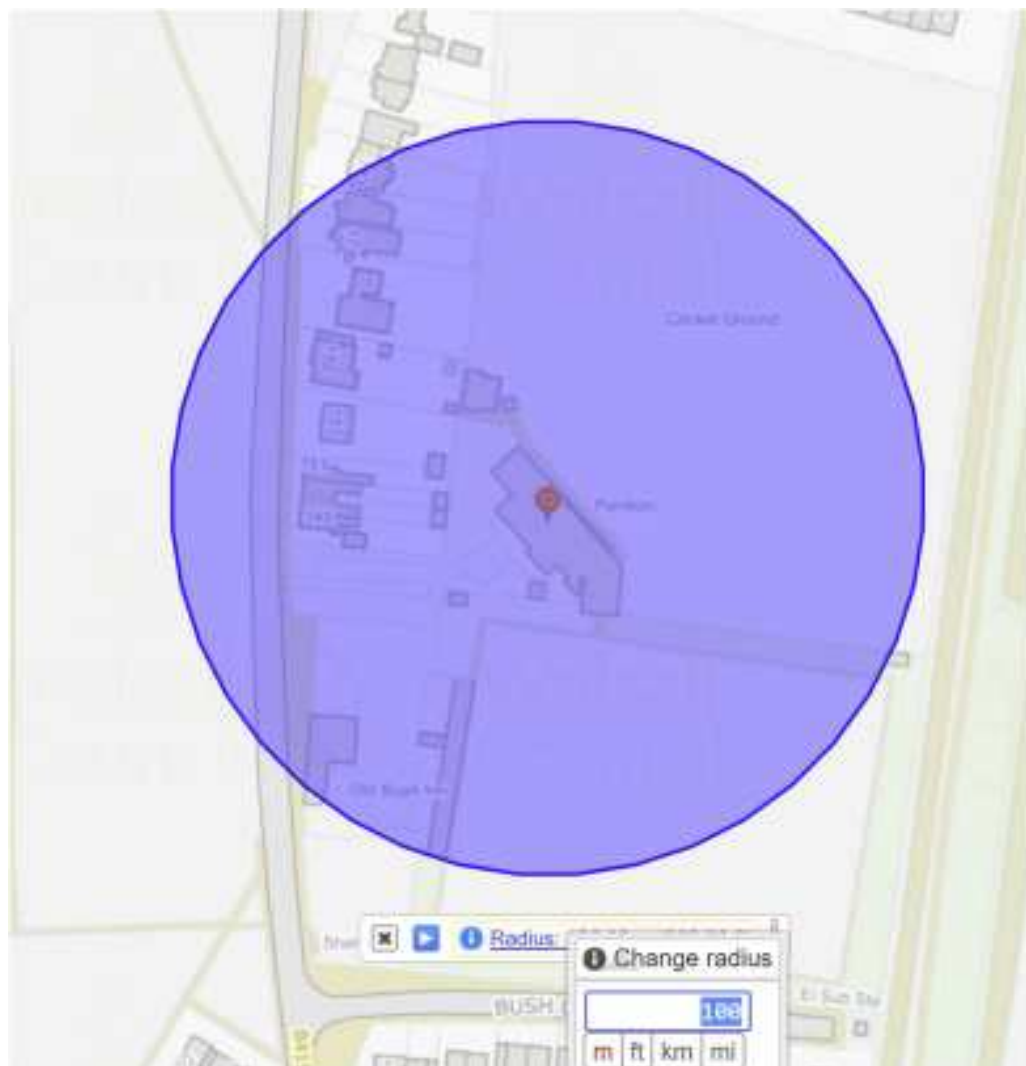

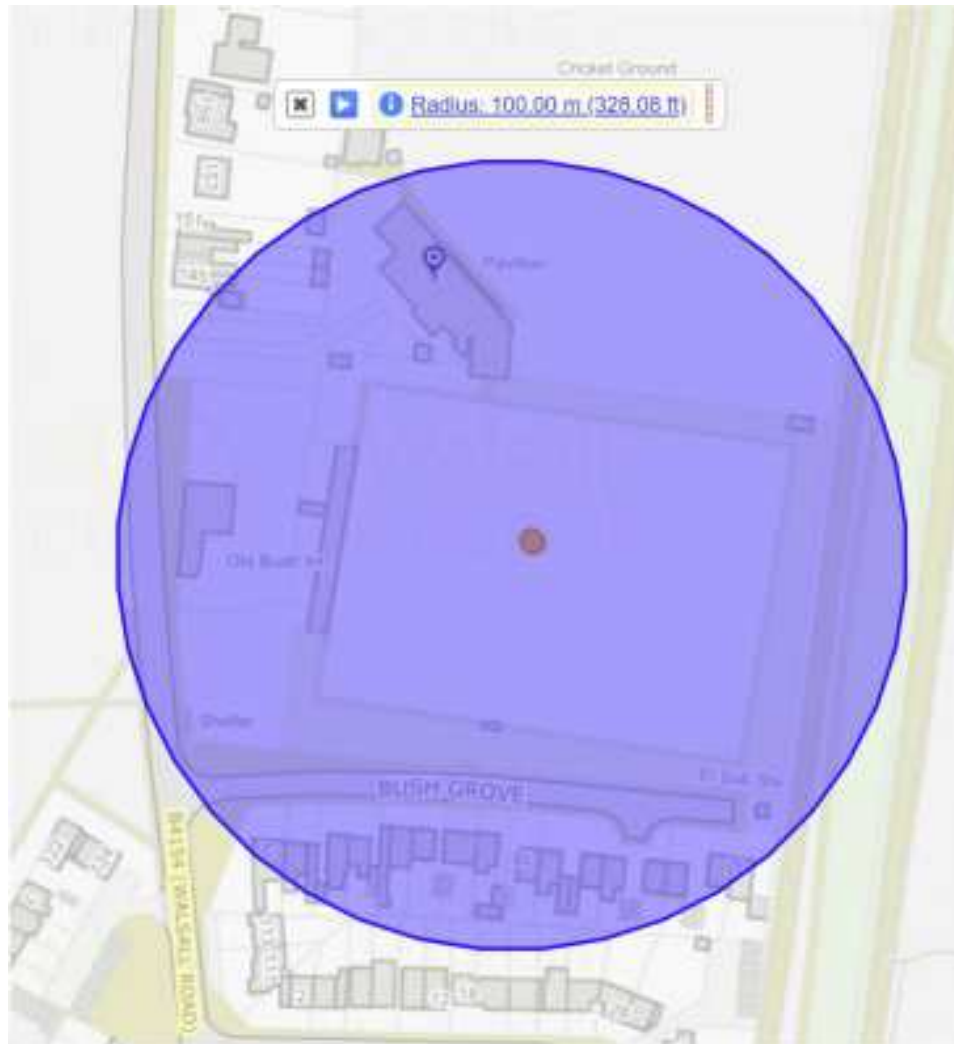

Objection to Application to vary Licence by Pelsall Cricket and Sports Club

I write to object to all aspects of the application to vary the premises licence of Pelsall Cricket and Sports Club.

I live at the above address, my family has been here for 40 years; the cricket club is behind us. The Cricket and Sports Club is part of Pelsall community and as such we accept the general noise that comes from the club.

However, it is not uncommon for late night disturbance which has on many occasions resulted in me having to ring the club and go around to speak to them about the noise.

It is commonplace when they have an event on for them to open the doors which face toward our property, the music from event is then clearly audible inside our home with the doors and windows shut.

It is also common to be disturbed by the clean up afterwards with the sound of glass bottles being emptied into the metal bins outside often well after 11pm.

On a number of occasions, they have had events outside, in particular, one night I was disturbed by what sounded like scaffolding being dismantled in the early hours approx. 1.30am, the people involved were laughing and joking. Further they had a fireworks display outside of the generally allowed dates/hours, it went on very late maybe 11pm. When I went round to complain, the fireworks came to an end, but then as I left, I heard that I thought to be a lawn mower. I went back in and was told it was in fact a leaf collector getting up the fireworks debris. This is completely unreasonable.

The above demonstrates their general lack of consideration towards the neighbours and inability to manage the premises to minimise noise nuisance.

When the club closes there is often noise from the patrons leaving, with them shouting on the carpark and the sound of their cars including papping of horns.

If they are allowed to open late no doubt all of the above disturbance will be pushed an hour later into the night.

In relation to large scale events on the field outside, I raise the following objections.

The existing club has its own number limits I believe to be 200. I assume these will be added to those requested for the outdoor events, making 699. As there is only one entry/exit route this should be taken into consideration. What are the intended limits in relation to three events of over 499 (699).

The onsite carparking is inadequate, there is already significant issues relating to visitors to the club parking on the main road and often on the common. In the time I have lived here I am aware of two serious car accidents involving cars travelling towards Rushall have hit vehicles parked on the road or attempting to pull out from the pub (now closed) where visibility is blocked by parked cars. This objection is in relation to public safety on the main road.

The common is protected by local by-laws preventing vehicles driving or parking on it. This objection is in relation to crime and disorder.

Further it is completely unreasonable to expect the residents of Walsall Road / Bush Grove to tolerate outdoor events involving the use of loudspeaker systems at any time of the day with nothing to mitigate the noise.

I also question the need for off sales.

This is a sports club and sports ground not an outdoor event space.

Re: Variation to licensing hours, Pelsall Cricket and Sports Club, Walsall Rd, Pelsall

As a local resident, who's private dwelling boundaries the above site, I am writing to raise my formal objection to the proposal for the Cricket and Sports Club to vary their hours from 11:00pm to 00:00 daily and to allow the use of the club and its facilities no more than 10 times per year for events; 3 being allowed to have in excess of 499 people.

The Cricket Club already enjoys a licence which permits the sale of alcohol until 23:00 hours and hosts various events throughout the year, many of which already create significant uplifts in traffic and local noise. This noise is especially noticeable during the summer months when the fire exit is often opened to allow cool air in.

The Cricket Club does have its own private, off road parking for vehicles. However, there is no designated, demarcated parking spaces and attendees park freely and often without consideration; there are no stewards or wardens on these occasions controlling access or egress of traffic. Large scale events very often result in traffic being forced to park outside on the main Walsall Road.

My objections on this matter are four fold:

- 1) 500+ people events would inevitably lead to traffic parking on Walsall Road outside resident's properties. Those of us residents that have off road driveways will be forced into higher risks when exiting our own properties as visibility from oncoming traffic will be significantly reduced. As 'The Club' is in a conservation area, we are greatly concerned that people may park their vehicles on 'The Common' opposite and around the area. The Commons are protected and local by-laws prevent the use of vehicles on these areas.
- 2) Many of the residents (especially those of us who boundary onto 'The Club') are either elderly or have young children. Clearly, due to our close proximity, the uplift in noise that would occur, especially at weekends, could very well disturb the peace which we are rightly entitled to during the very late evening and early morning hours.
- 3) Later opening hours and larger scale events will increase the likelihood of anti-social behaviour after midnight as alcohol will be allowed to be served for longer. This would clearly have an impact, not just on immediate residents, but in a wider context within the village surroundings.
- 4) Clearly, if any permission is granted to allow the variation of the licensing and entertainment hours to operate longer than is currently permitted, it sets a precedent for further applications to be approved.

I urge you to consider all these points when making your decision on this important matter.
