

Pheasey & Paddock Local Neighbourhood Partnership – 24th October 2006

Summary of report

Progress on active projects (all other projects are completed)

• Doe Bank Park Friends Group

Currently awaiting for the re-establishment of Doe Bank Park Users Group. Once this has been completed funds can be granted.

• Park Hall Junior School play equipment

The project form is complete allowing funds to be transferred. Monies will be used to develop the schools outdoor play area.

• Youth Project

3 of the sports coaching days have been reallocated to October's half term. Upon completion of the project Pertemps Coachright will provide a final report.

• Climbing walls for Chuckery School

Walls will have been installed on 18th October.

• Universal bins at Barry Road Path & Lonsdale Road

Bins have now been installed.

• Solar lights at passageway by St. Lukes church.

A grant agreement has been signed and funds have been sent to the group for purchase of lights.

Potential projects to be funded

- **Eco Girl**

Eco-Girl is an educational theatre production showing children the environmental issues that threaten our local communities, as well as the planet and how to deal with them. The show encourages audience participation and covers original songs. Eco-Girl covers areas of the national curriculum key stages one and two. The show covers topics such as the three R's (recycle, reduce and use reuse), not dropping litter and how to minimise waste. The show will also touch upon sustainability, the importance of exercise and anti-social behaviour. As part of the cross LNP money 2 of the Primary schools in the LNP area received the showing last year. The remaining schools include Meadow View JMI, Park Hall Juniors and Mayfield, each showing will cost £320, therefore a total of £960 is sought. £320 from Pheasey ward and £640 from Paddock ward.

- **Litter Competition and Collections**

It has been proposed that in order to tackle the litter related pledge a competition and series of litter picks take place in conjunction with the local primary schools. All pupils will be asked to design a litter awareness poster, the winning designs will then be displayed on public bins in the local area for a certain amount of time. Simultaneously each primary school will carry out a local litter pick at a local prominent site (health and safety permitting). Council services such as the press office and Streetpride have shown keen interest and have taken part in a small working group to progress this project. Estimated costs for the project are £700, it must be highlighted costs are estimations only as not all costs can currently be identified and measured.

As the project progresses certain elements of cost may be met by different council services similarly costs not currently identified will need to be met. The ballpark figure of £700 is a 'safe' amount as the project team do not envisage spending more than this.

The above project will be delivered in phases with the notion that following the above a similar type of project will be offered to the secondary schools.

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
